## THE GOOD NEWS

Like other churches, the Basilica of St. John Lateran in Rome is built on the foundations—physical, historical, emotional and spiritual—of an earlier building. The Emperor Constantine commissioned the original church in the fourth century.

Today, this church is the pope’s home parish. We’re used to seeing him address the entire world from St. Peter’s. But the Roman Pontifical Cathedral, the pope’s home base as bishop of Rome, is St. John Lateran. Pope Martin V is entombed in front of the main altar. Martin was elected to end the Great Western Schism. After a stay of about seventy years in Avignon, France, the papacy returned to Rome, to what was then (generously speaking) a backwater town. No glory there. A lot of ruins.

Not everyone in the Church’s power structure was happy with the move back. The late fourteenth and early fifteen- th centuries saw first two, then three men claim to be pope. The Council of Constance resolved the dilemma and elected Pope Martin.

St. John Lateran speaks power. The nave is flanked by statues of the apostles that are more than twice a normal person’s height. The architecture expresses strength in stone, grandeur, and magnificent art.

I’ve taken photographs of the building. They don’t capture the size of the place, but I can still feel it in my bones. In the nave I sensed the deep desire to speak of permanence and stability. But I felt keenly, too, the sense that stones can be pulled down and stained glass broken. Powerful buildings can say only so much.

And then my wife and I received the Eucharist at the Lateran Basilica. That reality helps me keep the place in perspective.

The Dedication of the Lateran Basilica in Rome

## God Is In Charge

Dear Brothers and Sisters of St. Jude,

As Catholics, we look upon the saints as “heros” of the Faith who rose above many obstacles to become great examples of holiness – real human persons filled with God’s life. We often tend to view them from a rags-to-riches sort of angle: that they came from illiteracy, poverty, lowliness, etc., to become “something”. Among them though, there are a good number who came from having everything (worldly speaking) to become something even greater. There are more saints from the ranks of the privileged classes than we may think.

Charles Borromeo was born in the castle of Arona on Lake Maggiore (North Italy) on Oct. 2, 1538. His father was Count Gilbert Borromeo, and his mother Margaret was of the house of Medici. Though Charles was an aristocrat, through and through, status was not to hinder him from achieving great sanctity. The greatest gift he received, of course, was that of faith. His parents had a great love for God and the Church and passed that devotion on to their six children.

His piety was obvious from an early age, and he was admitted to the clerical state at the tender age of 12 years. Subsequently, he was given the *benefice* of the rich abbey of Saints Gratian and Felinus at Arona by an uncle. Young as he was, he made clear that the money he received from it was strictly used for his education and the necessary maintenance of his household; the remainder was the patrimony of the poor.

He received his doctoral degree in his 22nd year, which happened after the death of both his parents. Shortly thereafter, following the death of Pope Paul IV, his uncle (his mother’s younger brother) was elected pope. Pius IV soon went to work in creating his nephew cardinal-deacon and administrator of the vacant see of Milan, while still keeping him very busy at Rome. Charles knew his position was most difficult, and wished to go off and spend the rest of his life in communion with God in a monastery. The saintly old archbishop of Braga convinced him to continue the path on which God had placed him for the good of the Church. This he did.

St. Charles expended much energy at the behest of the pope, reassembling the reforming Council of Trent which had been suspended in 1552. He was ordained priest in 1563, and two months later, he was consecrated bishop. When he finally arrived in Milan, the people were overjoyed, having been without a resident archbishop for over 80 years. Many of the clergy, however, were not so pleased. The level of worldliness and depravity among some of them railed against the reforms of the Council their holy archbishop sought to implement for his flock. On one occasion, he was not permitted to enter a church, and he was shot at, the bullet striking the cross in his hand. On another, while kneeling before the altar in prayer, a paid priest-assassin, Fr. Jerome Farina, shot him in the back. The bullet only bruised the saint and fell harmlessly to the ground. After a solemn thanksgiving, he consecrated his life anew to God and poured himself out all the more for the salvation of souls.

This brief synopsis only scratches the surface of what great work St. Charles did for the Church before his death on November 3, 1584, at the age of 46. By the grace of God, he overcame the obstacles, not of poverty, but of status and wealth, to win the crown of life everlasting. May he intercede for us that our lives may be so conformed to God as well.
