One, Holy, Catholic, and Apostolic Church



piritus Domini replevit orbem terrarum, alleluia. The Spirit of the Lord has filled the whole earth, alleluia. These words of the entrance antiphon (introit) of today's Mass remind us that the Holy Spirit has been poured forth upon the whole of creation, for without God's Spirit sustaining us at every moment, everything would go out of existence. But God does even better, in that His Spirit has been given to all believers to guide us in our daily lives, in decisions both great and small. We must call upon Him in faith, in good times and in bad, if we are to recognize His "voice."

Last Sunday, the Gospel was a portion of Jesus' "Priestly Prayer," that he offered to the Father at the Last Supper, praying for the unity of all those who would believe in Him. In his homily on the same, Father Todd read from a vintage Catholic tract published in the 1950's. This brief pamphlet entitled, "How Old is Your Church?" (Its' contents will be published in next week's letter), simply states when and by whom certain "branches" of Christianity came into being. The point of the tract is not to condemn members of non-Catholic bodies, but to delineate the firm foundation on which the Catholic Church was established by Jesus Himself.

The *Nicene-Athanasian Creed* (a.k.a.: The Profession of Faith) that we make most every Sunday and on Holy Days, was formulated at the first Ecumenical Council of the Church which took place at Nicea (present day Turkey) in the year 325 AD. Though the *Apostles Creed* had been professed for many years (and still is, especially at the beginning of the Holy Rosary), the council fathers—in response to heretical (untrue) teaching about Jesus' divinity—needed to emphasize the absolute basics of Catholic-Christian belief in Jesus and the Church. Among the articles enumerated, of which we are all familiar from recitation, are those known as the "notes" or *Marks of the Church*: that She is **one, holy, catholic, and apostolic**. Very simply:

The Church is One. She must have unity, because the above mentioned prayer of our Lord is God's will: that all who will believe in Jesus must be united in the Truth. The Church of the Apostles clearly emphasized oneness: "There is one body and one spirit, just as you were called to the one hope that belongs to your call, one Lord, one faith, one baptism, one God and Father of us all." (Eph. 4: 4-5). Division and falsehood in the Body of Christ is not God's will.

The Church is Holy. By virtue of the fact that Jesus is the Head of the Body, She must be holy as He is holy. That does not mean that members cease to be sinners, but that the Church has the sacramental means to make holy the sinners (us) that are in Her ranks. (See Eph. 5:25-27).

The Church is Catholic. This means that She is universal: for all peoples and all times. The Holy Spirit came upon the Church at Pentecost when "there were dwelling in Jerusalem Jews, devout men from every nation under heaven." (Acts 2:5). Many of these men from all over the known world accepted the true faith, and presumably brought it back to their own corners of the world. The Church is not restricted to any locality or ethnicity.

The Church is Apostolic. There is an organic, unbroken chain from Jesus Christ to His apostles directly to us today. The New Testament is filled with our Lord's commands to his closest disciples and of their carrying out those commands. The bishops of today are the legitimate successors to the Apostles, and can trace their *orders* back across the centuries to them. The whole of the faith has been handed down through them and their successors. The connection must be and is there. Without it, there could be no valid Eucharist: the *summit and source* of all Christian worship and life.

Therefore, man cannot bring forth the One, Holy, Catholic, and Apostolic Church. It is the *Lord and giver of Life* who fills the whole world and the Church with all that is of God. Let us offer thanks to the Father through the Son, for leading and guiding Holy Mother Church in the Holy Spirit of Truth and Love.

From there take the 571 bus and go two stops past the Coliseum. You'll see Saint Clement's. Pay the three Euros and go downstairs. It's amazing.



With just a day and a half left in Rome, we had lunch with a friend. From his balcony we looked into Saint Peter's Square, where we had stood just an hour before and heard Pope Benedict speak.

Our friend, teaching early-Church history in Rome, had visited a hundred churches in the city. We didn't have time for that many, so we asked him to recommend a couple. San Clemente was his top choice.

We walked through an eighteenth-century

façade into a twelfth-century courtyard. The current building was created over the filled-in space of a medieval church that originally dated back to the fourth century. And below that spot are the remains of a first-century building and a Mithraic temple.

All this has been excavated. The sense in Rome in general, and in this church in particular, is of walking through history. Even further below Saint Clement's are remnants of buildings destroyed by the emperor Nero's fire in the year 64.

It all started at Pentecost. The apostles—Peter who preached on that first day and Paul who carried the Gospel all over the Mediterranean—gave their lives in Rome. All over Rome are the reminders of the challenges the Church faced as it moved through the centuries. All over Europe and on each continent the message of Christ traveled, carried by human voices and human hands. All have heard in their “own tongues of the mighty acts of God.”

Great challenges face the Church in the world today. But the roots of our faith are deep. The Spirit moves through every layer, down every path, with and in us.
