# Adoration

St. John Vianney, (1786-1859) the patron saint of parish priests, has been the focus and model of this “Year for Priests.” Near the end of his life, when he was weak and worn from laboring for the salvation of souls; and after frequent attacks from the devil, both his body and voice were very weak. Therefore, when he would preach, (well before the existence of electric amplification) the congregation in his church could barely hear him. Yet, though they could not hear the words he spoke, they so often knew exactly what he was talking about for he did something that they had witnessed many times. Again and again, he would turn in the pulpit and with tears, point to the tabernacle saying, “He is there! He is there!” His flock had come to know the great faith and love that this holy *Cure’ of Ars* (France) had for Jesus present in the Most Blessed Sacrament of the Altar. They had learned to love and adore Him, too.

Today, we celebrate the Solemnity of Corpus Christi, the day on the Church calendar when we specifically emphasize our Lord’s Real and abiding Presence in the Holy Eucharist. Though it is still officially celebrated on the Thursday after Trinity Sunday in many places throughout the world, in the United States it is transferred to the following Sunday, and is technically regarded as an *external solemnity*. In numerous European countries, Corpus Christi Thursday is still a public holiday, but as secularization becomes more prevalent and the Faith is more and more treated as irrelevant, that practice will most certainly change. The reason it is celebrated on a Thursday because of Holy Thursday—the day on which Jesus instituted the Sacrifice of the Mass, taking the bread and the wine and changing it into His Body and Blood, telling His disciples to “Do this in remembrance of Me.”

There are numerous forms of prayer that we practice as Catholic Christians. That which is called worship or adoration is described by the **New Catholic Encyclopedia** as “*The reverential attitude of man toward God, by which he acknowledges with his whole being, soul and body, God’s absolute immensity, holiness, and glory and subjects himself to Him with such intensity that his disposition manifests itself in proper words and perceptible physical acts. Adoration, basically, is the directing of one’s whole being toward God, so that in all its diversity it is to the praise and glory of God...*”

When we come to participate in Holy Mass, adoration of God is clearly one of the modes of prayer in which we are to engage. But this mode can often get blurred in the midst of the scriptures, prayers, and hymns; and especially because of the exterior and interior distractions that are a reality of our overly busy lives in the 21st Century.

One way we show Jesus reverence is when we genuflect (bend the knee) towards the tabernacle upon entering and leaving church, acknowledging that the King is truly Present. And so, flowing from the celebration of Mass, is the worship of our Eucharistic Lord Who wills Himself to be made present primarily for the nourishment of His Mystical Body, but also that we may spend time with Him. God is everywhere, yet the Sacrament of the Altar gives us a tangible focus for our worship outside of Mass. When we go into a Catholic church, we are always home, because Jesus is there. We can spend time with Him present in the tabernacle (*Hebrew = dwelling place*) or when the Sacred Host is exposed in the monstrance for solemn adoration and benediction.

In many Catholic churches, solemn adoration and benediction is part of the rhythm of parish life. Some churches even have perpetual adoration, where people are praying before the Blessed Sacrament 24 hours a day. At St. Jude, we have formal periods of adoration every Wednesday, following the noon Mass, with benediction at 3:00PM, and on First Fridays from 8:00 to 9:00PM, and at select other times during the year. Next year, for this beautiful feast of Corpus Christi, we hope to have a full outdoor procession with four altars. Today will be a simple interior procession and benediction.

Come, and spend even a few minutes of precious time—the time that all ultimately belongs to Him—with the good God in the Most Blessed Sacrament. Time spent with the King of Love is never wasted. “He is there! He is there!” And He waits for you and for me.

# Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ

Everything comes together in the Eucharist. Abraham, our father in faith, is the root where God's promise and covenant begin. He is blessed by Melchizedek, a priest of God long before the Law is revealed. From the beginning, he brings bread and wine.

In Leviticus, God gives Moses rituals for various sacrifices: burnt offerings, grain offerings, guilt offerings, sin offerings, thanks offerings. The slaughtered sin offering was eaten by the priests.

In the Exodus, the Passover meal connects God's liberation of slaves and the blood of a lamb. On their desert journey, the gift of bread feeds these same people when they're desperate.

When Mary says, "May it be done to me according to your word," every heart that has said yes to God, that has moved from perplexity to trust, finds its home.

Saint Paul recounts what was already a tradition when he became an apostle: "that the Lord Jesus, on the night he was handed over, took bread... In the same way also the cup"—the cup that is the New Covenant in Christ's blood. The blood Christ gave in death the next afternoon is forever connected to us when we come to his table.

With Christ's resurrection, the preaching of his followers explodes with titles for Jesus. As Messiah, as Word, as Lamb, as Priest, Prophet,

and King, as Savior, as Son of Man, Son of David, and Son of God, as Bread of Life, as Alpha and Omega—everything comes together in Jesus Christ.

And still we have just started. The Church—the Body of Christ—lives because we come regularly to this table where Christ gives himself. We will continue to grow until this feast is completed at the heavenly banquet—the marriage supper of the Lamb. What we've just begun to recognize here, we'll see there fully.
