Shrine of Our Lady of the Island

Summer is here and it's grand. The Shrine is blooming, flowering, budding and growing. It makes the Brooklyn Botanical Gardens look pale by comparison. Come by and enjoy the Shrine.

“Ordinary Time”

We have re-entered what the Church calls “Ordinary Time”, and with a few exceptions, we shall see green vestments on Sundays from now until near the end of November. I really do prefer the former denotation for this time of the year which was known as the *Sundays or Time after Pentecost*. Since we mark the birth of the Church on that day, it is the reference point for those of us who live in the light of the sending forth of the Holy Spirit, Who is with us always. Though the term “Ordinary Time” is supposed to mean the *ordered or numbered* time outside of the seasons of Advent, Christmas, Lent and Easter, we generally translate *ordinary* as meaning “plain or boring” time. I really hope we one day return to *Post Pentecost!*

Based on Fr. Todd’s homily of Pentecost Sunday about the unity of the Church and how we have to be one in the Truth for unity to exist; and as I promised a couple of weeks ago, I will now relate the contents of the Catholic tract, “*How Old is your Church?*” This brief pamphlet points to the fact that although there are many Christian bodies or denominations, there is only one Church that can claim to be the one, holy, catholic and apostolic Church of Jesus Christ. Important to note: those Churches we generally refer to as “Orthodox,” have apostolic succession and valid sacraments. They have not departed from Tradition. Our relation with our Orthodox brethren is matter for another article.

And so, the tract relates the following information:

“If you are a Lutheran, your religion was founded by Martin Luther, an ex-monk of the Catholic Church, in the year 1517.

“If you belong to the Church of England, your religion was founded by King Henry VIII, in the year 1534 because the Pope would not grant him a divorce with the right to re-marry.

“If you are a Presbyterian, your religion was founded by John Knox in Scotland in the year 1560.

“If you are a Congregationalist, your religion was originated by Robert Brown in Holland in 1582.

“If you are a Baptist, you owe the tenets of your religion to John Smyth, who launched it in Amsterdam in 1606.

“If you are of the Dutch Reformed Church, you recognize Michaelis Jones as founder, because he originated your religion in New York in 1628.

“If you are a Protestant Episcopalian, your religion was an offshoot of the Church of England, founded by Samuel Seabury in the American colonies in the 17th century.

“If you are a Methodist, your religion was launched by John and Charles Wesley in England in 1744.

“If you are a Unitarian, Theophilus Lindley founded your church in London in 1774.

“If you are a Mormon (Latter Day Saints), Joseph Smith started your religion in Palmyra, NY, in 1829.

“If you worship with the Salvation Army, your sect began with William Booth in London in 1865.

“If you are a Christian Scientist, you look to 1879 as the year in which your religion was born and to Mrs. Mary Baker Eddy as its founder.

“If you belong to one of the religious organizations known as ‘Church of the Nazarine’, ‘Pentecostal Gospel’, ‘Holiness Church’, ‘Jehovah’s Witnesses’, your religion is one of the hundreds of new sects founded by men within the past fifty years.*

“If you are a Roman Catholic, you know that your religion was founded in the year 33 by Jesus Christ the Son of God, and that it has not changed since that time.

“Even in these strange days, the above enumerated facts are still undeniable.”

*(This was written in 1957. Currently there are well over 30,000 Protestant sects.)

Though certain external aspects of practice may have changed over the years, the substance of the Catholic Faith *has not* and *cannot* change. Let us be humbly grateful to God, who loves all His children unconditionally, for calling us into His Catholic Church, and pray that all who claim belief in Jesus Christ one day be united in the whole **Truth** that He is!

recognition. It's embarrassing to look at this man David. In each of us is a place where we know our own sin: *Have I betrayed someone who trusted me? Have I hidden from what I promised?* We understand David if we've ever struggled—if we've struggled even to admit what we've done.

And here is the amazing reality—this situation, this recognition, this depth is where God reaches into us to forgive. How deep is the problem? God's forgiveness is deeper. God's presence is deeper than the most treacherous sin. God forgives. When we're shaken most deeply by realizing how far we've moved away from God, God comes to us.

David's sorrow and repentance are all he had left. Though he suffered greatly because he sinned, still God saved him.
