# Father's Day 2010



On Friday, June 11th, the Solemnity of the Most Sacred Heart of Jesus, Pope Benedict XVI officially closed the "Year for Priests," and we as a parish community now mark the departure of Fr. Todd Saccoccia from St. Jude, Mastic Beach to Our Lady of Loreto, Hempstead, with gratitude for his three years of service to our parish. We hope the good people of Our Lady of Loreto will appreciate his preaching and presence as much as we do.

On the subject of priests, this past week, I received a copy of the following "From the Pastor" written by the well published Fr. George W. Rutler for his bulletin at the Church of Our Savior in NYC. With his permission, I submit the following work for your benefit:

*"These last few days saw thousands of priests from around the world gathered in Rome to honor Pope Benedict XVI as "Servant of the Servants of God," concluding the celebration of the Year for Priests. The Pope knows that the priesthood is the sign of Christ's sacrifice, and therefore it always will be a contradiction of false values. And, as a contradiction, it will especially be an offense during those phases of civilization that reject a higher vision of human purpose. Priests themselves have to be reminded of this daily.*

*"The concept of sacrifice, alien to a culture of self-assertion, is the foundation of moral strength. Friedrich Nietzsche, the philosopher of power, mocked Christ's willing submission to suffering for others, and thought that the beatitude delivered on the Mount—"Blessed are the meek"—constituted a "slave mentality." He did not realize that "meek," as used here, is rooted in the Greek word *paos*, and means the kind of discipline that tames a wild animal and makes it able to put its strength to useful purpose, which is why the "meek," so disciplined, inherit the earth. The priest must be tamed by the Holy Spirit so that his holy meekness will also strengthen the faithful. Nietzsche went insane, and it is said that his breaking point was when he watched a horse being beaten by its owner and could not reconcile this cruelty with his theories of "man as superman." St. John Vianney was the meekest, and strongest, of men, and said that a true understanding of the priesthood would not drive us insane, rather it would make us die "not out of fear but out of love."*

*"In a show of heroic meekness, 30 Catholic priests were killed last year on various continents, the highest number in the last 10 years. Last Sunday in Warsaw, more than 140,000 people attended the beatification of Father Jerzy Popieluzsko, who was beaten to death by Communist agents and tossed into a reservoir in 1984 at the age of 37. Since then, 17 million pilgrims have visited his tomb. His mother led the faithful in praying before his relics at the beatification. Saints are stronger than supermen.*

*"Last month, Pope Benedict XVI spoke of the priesthood when he went to Fatima, and was heard by a throng even larger than the crowds that welcomed Pope John Paul II in 2000. He told half a million people, "...we must cultivate an interior watchfulness of the heart which, for most of the time, we do not possess on account of the powerful pressure exerted by outside realities and the images and concerns which fill our soul."*

*"This is the power of holy meekness, which inherits the earth. The end of the Year for Priests is the beginning of a renewed response to St. John Vianney's definition: "The priesthood is the love of the heart of Jesus."*

God bless our Holy Father, Pope Benedict XVI, Fr. Todd, Fr. Rutler, and all fathers, whether they wear a Roman collar or not. May all who bear the title live up to the model of Fatherhood that comes from above.

# Something huge is happening around Jesus

If you were old enough to understand the news when it happened, you probably remember where and how you heard about the disaster of 9/11. Some of us are old enough to have a similar connection to the time and place where we found ourselves stunned by the Challenger explosion. Some of us have the same recollections about the assassination of President Kennedy. News that big, news that changes our world, seems to crack open our awareness so that we see things differently. We cannot make sense of what is in front of us. But we see everything clearly, deliberately.

Expectations and speculations are running deep. Everyone stumbles to explain him.

What went through people's minds when they heard Jesus preach that the reign of God was near? He asks his disciples, what are people saying? The answers they give are remarkable. Everyone knew John the Baptizer was dead. He'd crossed Herod, who had him killed. Yet some connected Jesus to him. Could John, who was dead, actually come back? Others thought Elijah had returned. They knew Elijah to be a prophet so great that he had been taken up into heaven without dying. His return meant Israel would be restored.

Something is in the air. Something huge is happening around Jesus. Expectations and speculations are running deep. Everyone stumbles to explain him.

And the disciples, the ones who knew Jesus the best? Peter speaks for them when he declares—you are the Messiah of God. Jesus “rebuked them and directed them”—tell no one. No one is going to get this. And no explanation can handle what is going to happen next. The Son of Man has to suffer and die. No one expected a Messiah to do that. And no one expected Jesus, the Messiah, to rise again.
