Prayer for Our Country

John Carroll (1735-1815) was the first Catholic bishop of the United States; Archbishop of Baltimore. He was born in Upper Marlborough, Maryland, with a distinguished family history in Ireland, England, and here in the New World. Numerous relatives were American patriots and statesmen. Among them was his cousin, Charles Carroll, a signer of the Declaration of Independence, in whose company John traveled to Canada, along with Samuel Chase and Benjamin Franklin, in a failed effort to win provincial support for the 13 Colonies in the revolt against England. His Episcopal Consecration on Aug. 15th, 1790 came about around the same time the U.S. Government was taking shape. He set precedent for cordial relations between the government and the Catholic hierarchy. Sadly, that relationship is not the same today.

As a movement is afoot to organize intercession for our nation by pausing every night at 9:00 p.m. Eastern Time to offer a minute of prayer for the safety of the U.S., our troops, our citizens, and for a return to a Godly nation, I here offer the words that Archbishop Carroll wrote in his **Prayer for the Civil Authorities of Our Country**:

We pray Thee, O almighty and eternal God, Who through Jesus Christ hast revealed Thy glory to all nations, to preserve the works of Thy mercy, that Thy Church, being spread throughout the whole world, may continue with unchanging faith in the confession of Thy name.

We pray Thee, Who alone art good and holy, to endow with heavenly knowledge, sincere zeal, and sanctity of life, our chief Bishop, N. N. vicar of our Lord Jesus Christ, in the government of His Church; our own archbishop, N. N. (or bishop); all other bishops, prelates, and pastors of the Church; and especially those who are appointed to exercise amongst us the functions of the holy ministry and to conduct Thy people into the way of salvation.

We pray Thee, O God of might, wisdom and justice, through Whom authority is rightly administered, laws are enacted, and judgment is decreed, assist with Thy holy spirit of counsel and fortitude the President of the United States, that his administration may be conducted in righteousness, and be eminently useful to Thy people over whom he presides; by encouraging due respect for virtue and religion; by a faithful execution of the laws in justice and mercy; and by restraining vice and immorality. Let the light of Thy divine wisdom direct the deliberations of Congress, and shine forth in all the proceedings and laws framed by our rule and government, so that they may tend to the preservation of peace, the promotion of national happiness, the increase of industry, sobriety, and useful knowledge; and may perpetuate us to the blessings of equal liberty.

We pray for his Excellency, the Governor of this State, for the members of the Assembly, for all judges, magistrates, and other officers, who are appointed to guard our political welfare, that they may be enabled, by Thy powerful protection, to discharge the duties of their respective stations with honesty and ability.

We recommend likewise to Thy unbounded mercy all our brethren and fellow-citizens throughout the United States, that they may be blessed in the knowledge, and sanctified in the observance of Thy most holy law; that they may be preserved in union, and in that peace which the world cannot give; and after enjoying the blessings of this life, be admitted to those which are eternal.

Finally, we pray Thee, O lord of mercy, to remember the souls of Thy servants who are gone before us with the sign of faith, and repose in the sleep of peace; the souls of our parents, relatives and friends; and those who when living were members of this congregation, and particularly of such as are lately deceased; of all Thy benefactors who, by their donations or legacies to this church, witnessed their zeal for the decency of divine worship, and proved their claim to our grateful and charitable remembrance. To these, O Lord, and to all that rest in Christ, grant we beseech Thee, a place of refreshment, light, and everlasting peace, through the same Jesus Christ, our Lord and Saviour. Amen.

God has blessed America. May all who benefit from His manifold blessings remember this truth: although there is "Separation of Church and State" in the U.S., if we use our freedom to eliminate God from the public sphere, that freedom which comes from Him shall no longer be ours.

Scientists and theologians sometimes work the same cases.

A friend of mine finished his graduate studies and did a year of postdoctoral work in the northwest. He's a moral theologian specializing in medical ethics.

He's no armchair coach, looking at life from the sidelines: Not long after ordination, he spent time as a hospital chaplain, and he's done night-shift ride-alongs with police officers, learning about human nature from people on the street as well as from those in the squad cars.

He also worked in a facility that housed criminal offenders undergoing psychiatric treatment, spending hours in group sessions led by the prison's psychiatrist.

At times they discussed inner voices they had followed, voices that had led them to commit crimes.

"It depends what the voices tell them."

My friend remembered vividly one conversation with the doctor after a meeting. My friend said, "These men hear voices. The founder of my religious order heard voices. From a psychiatric point of view, how do we know whether to lock people up or call them saints?" The psychiatrist had a simple response: "It depends what the voices tell them."

If you murder another human being, we'll lock you up. If you sell everything you own and give the money to the poor, we'll call you a saint. A lot of people may be challenged to follow your example.

I'm intrigued that my friend still tells this story decades after the fact. What message is worth spreading? What insight is worth handing on year after year? Real wisdom—truths tested against real human experience—shows where the voice of God has resonated in human hearts.

When a severe storm is forecasted or some other event impacting reliability of services occurs, LIPA will call our critical care customers so they can make advanced preparations, and we can get their power on. We need our customers to contact us and provide a medical certificate from their doctor, or local Board of Health, so we can note the account and tag the meter as "Critical Care" There are 11 devices that meet the medical criteria for life support equipment, which includes: Apnea Monitors, Curraise Respirator, Positive Pressure Respirator, Suction Machine, IV Feeding Machine, Tank Type Respirator, Respirator/Ventilator, Homodialysis Machine, Rocking Bed Respirator, Oxygen Coordinator, IV Medical Infusion Machine.
