# urrent Events

Life is a continuum: even though many seek to reach a place in life where they can gear down and relax and enjoy the fruits of their labors without stress, hardships and difficulties, we never seem to reach such a “stable” point where this happens. Joys and sorrows; birth and death; pleasures and pains; successes and failures are all part of the mix. Ultimately, that ‘place’ we are all seeking is life with God forever. The sooner we accept the realities of this life, with an eye on the life to come, the sooner we can experience some sense of peace, seeing all the positives and negatives as somehow being able to be turned to the Good.

Ten years ago, (I have mentioned this before) Fr. Mirro was pastor, with three parochial vicars and one additional priest living in residence here at St Jude. Three years ago, Fr. Todd and I came here. Along with Fr. Augustine, we were three full-time priests in the rectory to serve the parish. Less than a year later, Fr. Augustine returned to India. With Fr. Todd’s recent reporting to Our Lady of Loreto Parish in Hempstead (I’m going to visit him there in a couple of weeks), St. Jude is now officially a one-priest parish, along with a “retired” resident, Msgr. John Heinlein, who fortunately, is very energetic and hard working. I am grateful for his willingness and generosity to continue serving Jesus Christ and His Holy Church at such a full-time pace, at the fine age of 77.

As I have mentioned to numerous people, Fr. Todd’s position could have been filled by another priest (for at least the short term), and Msgr. John could have remained in residence without the workload. However, the reality I was faced with was the very strong likelihood that the priest assigned to us would not be a native speaker of the English language; Although we were blessed prior with several priests from other countries who were affable and easily comprehensible (Fr. Augustine Pizakayatt and Fr. Joseph Baidoo immediately come to mind). If this were the case, I might constantly be requested for every funeral, wedding, blessing, etc... simply because most people want a priest they can understand when he is performing his priestly duties. With that being said, I am very grateful to have Msgr. John’s presence, friendship, and service; along with Fr. James Leone, as I’m sure you all are too.

Last Tuesday evening, June 29th, approximately 50 people responded to the Society of St. Vincent de Paul “Call to Serve” here at St. Jude. What a beautiful sign of discipleship! How wonderful it is that so great a number of our parishioners are willing to take a part in serving Christ present in the less fortunate of our community. A follow-up meeting will be held on Monday, July 19th (details noted elsewhere in this bulletin) to try and solidify how our revived conference will operate and interface with our parish outreach in how to best serve the material and spiritual needs of the clients who are seeking assistance. I will keep you informed.

Lastly, you may have noticed some changes to our church’s sound system. We now have a “mouse” microphone (like the one on the altar) at the pulpit instead of the former gooseneck one, and there are now two hanging microphones positioned above the choir area. They seem to be working well. The workers who installed them will be back to fine tune the system so that we can get the best possible sound quality for our church celebrations.

Small improvements and large, we are steadily trying our best to maintain and upgrade all our facilities, for the present and future needs of St. Jude Parish. I hope to have a parish center update for you within the next few weeks. God bless, and enjoy the summer weather!

I was a little kid when my father taught my mother to use a stick shift. My sister and I sat in the back seat as the car jolted in stops and starts on the vacant parking lot near our house. My father was frustrated. My mother was frustrated and miserable. My sister and I were scared to death.

My first time driving with a clutch was incredibly awkward. The second time too. I couldn't get the feel of it. Worse yet, I couldn't see how I was ever going to get the feel of it. My father, patient, kept me at it. And at one point, it clicked. I knew what a clutch was supposed to feel like.

My wife and I took turns teaching our sons to drive in a huge parking lot in

a park. On any Saturday half a dozen or so families bond in that park. The lot is long enough for your car to

get into second and even third gear before you hit the grass. Someone set up huge empty metal barrels on the edge of the lot so new drivers can also practice parallel parking without hitting anything that matters.

What has any of this to do with today's readings?

In Deuteronomy, we are reminded that God's Word is very close to us. It's in our heart for us to follow. In Luke, Jesus is asked how to inherit eternal life. He asks the questioner —what do *you* think? The man knew what to do. Jesus simply said, now go do that.

Colossians reminds us that Christ lives in us—the image of God who created heaven and earth and has power over anything that might test us.

We may not get it at first, but that's who is teaching us.
