## Orthodox and Catholic

While these two words are commonly used to denote particular Church affiliation, they have clear definitions in and of themselves which are used by both ecclesial families. From the Greek, the word **orthodox** means “right teaching.” (As a side note, that which is referred to as “heterodox” means “incorrect teaching,” from whence the word “heresy” comes; that which controverts the truth.) When used with an upper case “O,” the word “Orthodox” generally refers to those Churches that are of the East, who do not recognize the primacy and jurisdiction of the Roman Pontiff. (**Warning:** my attempt to give a basic exposition on this very complicated topic in one page will not be easy. It would be complicated in ten pages; so if this confuses more than clarifies, my sincere apologies.)

Again from the Greek, the word **catholic** means “universal.” Most all those who are baptized into the Life of the Blessed Trinity profess their belief in “one, holy, **catholic**, and apostolic Church,” as we do on Sundays. Yet, there is far from total agreement among the various bodies on what precisely constitutes Christian universality. When used with an upper case “C,” the word “Catholic” refers to all those Churches, West and East, that are in union with the Holy Father, the Pope.

As mentioned in the bulletin of January 16th, there was general unity among Christians, East and West, Orthodox and Catholic, until the year 1054, when the formal rupture between Rome and the Patriarchate of Constantinople (present day Istanbul, Turkey), the “Rome of the East”, took place. All of these Churches had participated in the first seven general ecumenical councils which were convened prior to that date; called to clarify and define doctrinal issues within the Christian Faith. Though the Orthodox recognize the Bishop of Rome as the legitimate successor to St. Peter, they see him as “First among equals,” and not as having primacy over all other sees.

Our *Latin Rite* structural and liturgical experience of Catholicism is relatively simple when compared to that of the Orthodox. Many Catholics, since we may have had no interaction with *Eastern Rite Catholics*, are under the assumption that all who are in union with Rome are of the *Latin Rite*. In addition to the Latin Rite, there are also Ukranian, Ruthenian, Greek, Russian, Chalcedonian, Coptic, et al. Fourteen rites all together, whose language and manner of celebrating the Eucharist and the Sacraments have great variations from what we are used to, yet they are all of ancient usage and recognized as legitimate by the authority of the See of Peter. They are just as Catholic as we are. Accordingly, we are permitted to receive Holy Communion in these Churches, just as they are in ours. Again, though the externals of language and manner of celebration are similar to their corresponding Orthodox counterparts, we are in union with them.

The Orthodox, however, while possessing a hierarchal clergy structure as we, do not necessarily have a clearly unified hierarchy, as Catholics do in the Roman Pontiff, in whom we invest a high degree of our identity. There exist Rites within Orthodox Christianity that correspond to the Catholic ones mentioned above, and whose bishops are canonically attached to one of the ancient patriarchates of Constantinople, Alexandria, Antioch and Jerusalem; as well as other more recently formed ones. There are additionally many other governing divisions and sub-divisions headed by bishops who enjoy varying degrees of self-governance and/or independence and autonomy without any direct connection to a patriarch archbishop, or a bishop of lesser rank / jurisdiction. Byzantine, to say the least, and I cannot imagine figuring out how they inter-relate with the ease that we Catholics can from diocese to diocese around the world.

Though we are quite close in our beliefs and practices on the Sacraments, Our Blessed Mother, and the veneration of saints, divisions still exist. Let us continue to pray for the unity of the Church, as we thank God for the gift of our Catholic Faith. May we all grow in His Grace.

# Light of the World

I admit it—I'm a compulsive candle-lighter. Candles provide warmth and a cozy atmosphere and, especially, they bring God to mind. I keep a candle burning next to me when I work on something challenging—it reminds me of God's constant presence.

Today, Jesus calls us "light." I'm not always comfortable thinking of myself this way—I tend to associate God, rather than myself, with light. But Jesus is clear—whether we are candles, oil lamps, or incandescent bulbs, we are "the light of the world,"

meant to shine forth with good works. The prophet Isaiah declares God's preference for those good works: to share bread with the hungry, shelter the homeless, end oppression, and remove suffering from the afflicted. God challenges us to undertake charity and justice—to provide for those in need and to dismantle systems that oppress God's children.

Jesus declares that through  
our good works,  
others know and glorify God.

We know this is God's desire—yet our lights often dim with the challenges of these good works.

Systems are difficult to change; the hungry or homeless can be unappreciative or rude; the needy sometimes spend money frivolously instead of on food or shelter. It's enough to send us scrambling for a bushel to hide our flickering lights.

But Jesus wants none of our excuses. Scripture says our good works lead straight to God. Isaiah tells us that when we give to charity and work for justice—appreciated

or not, successful or not—God hears our prayers and heals our wounds. Jesus declares that through our good works, others know and glorify God.

Our candles may flicker, but we can't allow them to be extinguished. God seeks to be known by us and by others—through nothing less than the light of our very selves.

Pilgrimages include round-trip airfare (usually from New York City), comfortable accommodations in superior tourist hotels (or, on occasion, in friaries, convents or monasteries), breakfast and dinner, ground transportation in air-conditioned coaches or cars, guided tours of shrines and historic sites, entrance fees to all sites and events scheduled on the tours.
