Gluttony

Good news to all those who really enjoy their food! Gluttony is far from the worst sin in the world. The bad news? It is still a capital or deadly sin. Gluttony is described as “*The sin and vice opposed by way of excess to the virtue of abstinence, whose function is to control the desire and use of food and non-intoxicating drink. The virtuous man will take nourishment of proper quality and sufficient quantity to maintain his physical life and well-being (somatic, psychic, and social) but without exceeding the limit set by prudence (practical wisdom or practical reason to right-doing) with a view to that same end.*” (The Catholic Encyclopedia) St. Thomas Aquinas defines gluttony as “*the immoderate or unreasonable pleasure in food and drink.*”

Food in itself is a blessing from God. Our entire life revolves around food. The very essence of our Catholic Faith is centered on the Holy Eucharist, “the Bread of Life”. Food and water (nutrition and hydration) are absolute necessities to sustain life. However, it is when we exceed our consumption of food from sustenance to surfeit, that the sin of gluttony can bear its tempting face. Sharing food with those who have less is an act of charity, which the good God commands us.

The act of fasting as transcribed in the Old Testament is almost always connected with prayer and repentance, yet, not so much in the context of giving strength to one’s prayers. However, it is interesting that aside from our Lord’s 40 day fast (of great messianic significance), in the writings throughout New Testament there is little mention of the practice of fasting; nor, is excessive eating noted at length. Although, St. Paul strongly condemns the behavior of the gluttonous: *Their end is destruction. Their God is their stomach; their glory is in their “shame.”* Philipians 3:19.

Gluttony is not exclusively physical, but psychological and spiritual as well. We can attempt to fill up our spiritual hunger with sensual pleasures; finite goods. It is in the excessive use of things which in themselves are legitimate. It can also be applied to the quantity one consumes and the manner of consumption (i.e.: In a voracious manner), and to the quality or perhaps extreme particularity as well. For instance, for some people only the “absolute best” will do, even though one cannot afford it. On the other end of the spectrum, one who purposely eats precious little, with the knowledge it is harmful to their body, can be considered a glutton for the disproportionate value placed upon food. Wasting resources is another form of gluttony. One example is heating a home that is too large for the occupants; consuming copious amounts of oil with possibly no regard for the family who cannot afford heat. “*The rich man who feasted every day in splendid fashion was buried in hell, but more, it would seem, because he was preoccupied with his self-indulgence that he had no compassion towards the poor who were in need (Lk 16:19-31) than because of simple gluttony.*” (The Catholic Encyclopedia). Gluttony can make us sluggish of body and soul; deaf and blind to God’s Spirit and to the needs of those around us.

The ancient Catholic practices of asceticism, meaning the disciplining of our lower nature so that it doesn’t ascend and dominate our lives, is the answer. This is what the Church exhorts us to do especially during Lent, and also throughout our lives; controlling the desires of our bodies so that they do not control us! Moderation in our consumption of anything is **always** the best —and most difficult—rule to live by.

Commemorated this week, The Irish Hunger Martyrs (1845-51) (www.irishhungercomm.wordpress.com) who died from the infamous potato blight and the subsequent, not-so-well-known controlled starvation of many who refused to renounce their Catholic faith for food, is something of which we should be informed. Perhaps we might be able to make a donation to Outreach or St. Vincent de Paul to provide for the needs of those who may go without in remembrance of these ancestors in the Faith.

On another note, MANY, MANY, THANKS to all who have contributed to the ‘2011 Catholic Ministries Appeal’. We have well surpassed our goal in pledges and I am most grateful for all who have made this sacrifice to support our Diocese of Rockville Centre and our parish of St. Jude. You have come through BIG, and I am most appreciative.

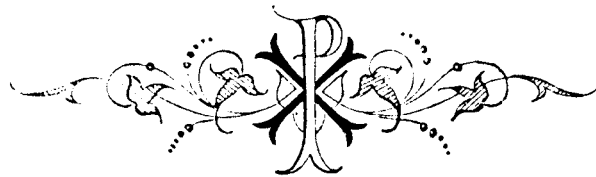
