Needs and Ends” at St. Jude...

The work on the parish center auditorium is well underway. The new heat and air conditioning equipment is mostly in place. Some more of the roughing-in work and then the finishing remain. The soffit on the three walls of the main room have been framed (in front of the stage, there will be no soffit) and are ready for the electrical and sound system work to be run within them. The central suspended acoustical ceiling is following,

as well as framing for the walls which are currently either painted concrete block or split concrete block. The entirety of the room will be painted gypsum wallboard, with wainscoting and pilasters and attractive moldings. It is really going to be a beautiful room. Those of you who have given to the capital campaign are seeing the fruits of your generosity.

In my letter of March 20th, I informed the parish about the status of the old church. Along with many other details of what would be required to bring the edifice up to code as a useable, public meeting space, it was included that *“in order to stabilize the structure, steel I-beam buttresses would have to be fabricated and sunk into the ground outside to shore-up the exterior walls and roof... we may be looking at a realistic cost of about \$400,000. If such a renovation were realized, there would also be the additional issue of the annual maintenance costs of heating, cooling, electric, cleaning, etc., which would then add to the parish budget.”* I therefore made the request: *“If there are parishioners who believe that it is worth looking into raising funds to save the old church, I heartily invite them to speak with me about a plan of how to do so.”*

Since that was written over two months ago, no one has approached me about a plan. The only “pledge” that has been made towards it was by a parishioner who offered to get the parish a good price on the steel necessary for the buttresses. I was grateful, but thus far that has been the only “pledge” made to save the old church... I’m not completely certain, but I believe the parishioners of St. Jude are giving me a “silent answer” of how to proceed in this matter. I can’t guarantee for how much longer, but my request for a plan (should anyone have one) still remains.

Thanks to Tom, Aida, and Sam Dankowski who prepared the planters and planted flowers (and continue to water and maintain them) in front of the parish center, the rectory front and side doors, and at the Outreach entrance. Members of the Men’s and Youth Groups have offered to assist. If anyone else would be interested in maintaining a section of flowers or greenery around the church or parish grounds, please speak to me or Aida at Outreach.

Thanks as well to Eagle Scout candidate Andrew Stock for the work he and his crew put in to restore the badly damaged statue of St. Jude that had been behind the rectory for many years. The statue has been relocated to the garden cove closest to the east side of the church. St. Jude has already become quite the celebrity for photos following weddings, First Communions, and Confirmation.

You may occasionally notice two young gentlemen serving at weekend Masses. They are seminarians studying for the priesthood for our diocese. One is Mr. David Atanasio, who will be entering his second year of studies at the major seminary in Huntington. He is living at the rectory while he works at his summer job. The other is Mr. Roger Velasquez, who is a member of St. Jude parish, preparing to enter his second year in the college program at Douglaston. We are very happy to have them among us, and pray that, God willing, they persevere in their study and formation to priestly ordination.

Next Sunday, June 12th, is Pentecost. If possible, wear something red (yellow and orange are also appropriate colors) to Mass for the fire of the Holy Spirit!

May God bless them and their families!

It's a day to feel empty.

Normally, I wouldn't encourage this. But imagine how Jesus' disciples felt—first, devastated by his death; next, overjoyed at his resurrection and presence with them; and today, left confused and empty as Jesus departs a second time.

Military families know this emotional roller coaster: initial sadness as their soldier leaves for a foreign land, immense rejoicing when the soldier returns for a two-week leave, intensified sadness when the brief visit ends. Others know similar feelings when a child graduates and moves away or begins a new life through marriage, or when a spouse dies after a long illness.

Sometimes we seek to fill moments of emptiness with TV, shopping, gambling, or food. But the Ascension readings challenge us to stay with the emptiness for a time. Life teaches us that endings lead to new beginnings. We know that next Sunday, on

Pentecost, we will celebrate a beginning—the birth of the Church—that could have occurred only through Jesus' departure.

But the time between endings and beginnings can feel quite empty.

Though nothing can truly fill those empty moments, we can take comfort in our community of family, friends, and parishioners. In the days after Jesus' departure, the disciples remained together, supporting and upholding one another.
