Holy Spirit, Come!

Life as we know it can be difficult. Sometimes it can be very difficult. The good news is that, even though at times it may appear so, darkness has not overcome the Light; because the Light is Jesus Christ. Through the saving waters of Baptism, and perfected in Confirmation, we have been given the power and strength to be Christ's presence in the world. St. Cyril of Jerusalem (ca. 315-386) provides a beautiful exposition on the working of the Third Person of the Most Holy Trinity in the world and in our lives:

"The water that I shall give him will become in him a fountain of living water, welling up into eternal life. This is a new kind of water, a living, leaping water, welling up for those who are worthy. But why did Christ call the grace of the Holy Spirit water? Because all things are dependent on water; plants and animals have their origin in water. Water comes down from heaven as rain, and although it is always the same in itself, it produces many different effects, one in the palm tree, another in the vine, and so on throughout the whole of creation. It does not come down, now as one thing, now as another, but while remaining essentially the same, it adapts itself to the needs of every creature that receives it.

"In the same way, the Holy Spirit, whose nature is always the same, simple and indivisible, apportions grace to each man as He wills. Like a dry tree which puts forth shoots when watered, the soul bears the fruit of holiness when repentance has made it worthy of receiving the Holy Spirit. Although the Spirit never changes, the effects of His action, by the will of God and in the name of Christ, are both many and marvelous.

*"The Spirit makes one man a teacher of divine truth, inspires another to prophesy, gives another the power of casting out devils, enables another to interpret Holy Scripture. The Spirit strengthens one man's self-control, shows another how to help the poor, teaches another to fast and lead a life of asceticism, makes another oblivious to the needs of the body, trains another for martyrdom. His action is different in different people, but the Spirit Himself is always the same. In each person, Scripture says, *the Spirit reveals His presence in a particular way for the common good.* The Spirit comes gently and makes Himself known by His fragrance. He is not felt as a burden, for He is light, very light. Rays of light and knowledge stream before Him as He approaches. The Spirit comes with the tenderness of a true friend and protector to save, to heal, to teach, to counsel, to strengthen, to console. The Spirit comes to enlighten the mind first of the one who receives Him, and then, through Him, the minds of others as well.*

"As light strikes the eyes of a man who comes out of darkness into the sunshine and enables him to see clearly things he could not discern before, so light floods the soul of the man counted worthy of receiving the Holy Spirit and enables him to see things beyond the range of human vision, things hitherto undreamed of." (From a catechetical instruction by St. Cyril of Jerusalem, bishop.)

Before Jesus tangibly left this earth, ascending to His Father, our blessed Lord promised His disciples that He would always be with them through the power of the Holy Spirit. The Paraclete guides the Church, the Body of Christ, and it is essential that we invite Him into our hearts and homes every day, so that we too may live godly lives. Never should we take it for granted how blessed we are to be members of the Catholic Church; to know and be in relationship with the Triune God, and how the Holy Spirit wills to guide and refresh us, and renew the face of the earth... **through us!**

Come Holy Spirit, come, and renew the face of the earth.

Why “Spirit” instead of “Ghost”?

Q

When and why did the Church start using “Holy Spirit” instead of “Holy Ghost”?
—Paula

Dear Paula,

There is no magic date for a wholesale switch between “Holy Spirit” and “Holy Ghost,” but the tendency to refer to the third person of the Holy Trinity as the “Holy Spirit” was strongly affected by the official translation of the sacred liturgy into English during and after Vatican II.

The International Commission on English in the Liturgy was set up in 1963 to guide the translation of our ritual prayers from the official Latin into English, and their option for spirit over ghost has shaped our official prayer ever since.

The terms were also affected by the shift from older English translations of the Scriptures to more recent English translations like the New American Bible where, as in the liturgy, “Holy Spirit” was adopted as the more standard translation of Greek and Hebrew terms.

Over time, in common English usage ghost has moved from meaning “the living essence of a person” to having a greater association with the dead and the paranormal, so the changes to the official translation were beneficial from a cultural as well as a linguistic standpoint.

Pentecost Sunday

Pentecost is God's biggest surprise party. Jesus' disciples and Jews from distant nations had traveled to Jerusalem to observe the agricultural feast of Pentecost, marking the end of the grain harvest.

They thought they were fulfilling their normal religious observations. But then, with rushing wind and tongues of fire, God hollered "Surprise!" and filled the disciples with the Holy Spirit. They had gathered for religious observance, but God had gathered them for a celebration.

Pentecost truly serves as the surprise birthday party for the Church—the day the Church was born in the power of the Spirit. The visiting Jews were able to understand the disciples in their native languages because God's gift of the Holy Spirit unified strangers.

In 1 Corinthians, Paul highlights the Spirit's unifying nature. Our Church is one body, filled with one Spirit, created by one Lord. Though each of us is blessed with

different gifts and born into different circumstances, we are knit into one body by the Spirit.

Yet we know well how religion has been used to divide nations, peoples, and families. As Christians, we ought to feel deeply saddened at the times our faith and many other faiths have abandoned the uniting power of the Spirit and fostered discord, violence, and intolerance.

But even the most divisive human actions cannot suppress the Spirit's power. The tongues of fire cannot be quenched. The rushing wind of God will not be slowed.

Every time we extend a hand of welcome, every time we reconcile with another, every time we seek to bring people together, we open our hearts to the Spirit's movement. It's our surprise gift back to God in gratitude for the precious gift of the Holy Spirit.
