Receiving Holy Communion, Part I

Fifty years ago, when receiving our Blessed Lord in Holy Communion, there was a straightforward protocol which was followed by all the faithful: The priest descended from the altar with the Eucharist, while those who were properly prepared and disposed to receive came to the altar rail and knelt down. When the priest approached each individual, they would put out their tongue; the priest then made the sign of the cross with the Host and placed it on their tongue while saying (in Latin), “*May the Body of our Lord Jesus Christ keep your soul unto life everlasting. Amen.*” The communicant said nothing, arose, then returned to his/her place in the congregation to kneel down and pray. It was a very simple and reverent procedure, subject to little personal interpretation.

In 1969, Pope Paul VI responded to the request of some bishops (and theologians) to allow for the reception of Holy Communion in the hand. In his document, *Memoriale Domini*, the Holy Father, with serious misgivings, gave permission for the Body of our Lord to be received as it had been for a period of time in the early years of Christianity. (Consequently, because of the abuses, profanation, and lack of reverence which ensued among the faithful in those early years, the Church eventually mandated that the faithful were to receive only on the tongue.) Among the greatest concerns Paul VI expressed was that people would lose faith in the Real Presence:

“A change in a matter of such moment, based on a most ancient and venerable tradition, does not merely affect discipline. It carries certain dangers with it which may arise from the new manner of administering Holy Communion: the danger of a loss of reverence for the august sacrament of the altar, of profanation, of adulterating the true doctrine.”

On January 30, 2011, the Very Rev. Fr. John Lankeit, rector of Ss. Simon & Jude Cathedral in Phoenix, Arizona wrote to his parishioners, addressing some abuses commonly observed, seeking to correct them:

“While my main objective in encouraging reception on the tongue is to deepen appreciation for the Eucharist, I also have a pastoral responsibility to eliminate abuses common to receiving in the hand. Such abuses are no doubt unintentional. Nevertheless, what I witness troubles me. And I’m not alone.

“In 2004, responding to the problem of Eucharistic profanation, the Vatican’s Congregation for Divine Worship and the Discipline of the Sacrament released an official instruction entitled *REDEMPTIONIS SACRAMENTUM: On certain matters to be observed or to be avoided regarding the Most Holy Eucharist*. Regarding Holy Communion the document states:

“[S]pecial care should be taken to ensure that the Host is consumed by the communicant in the presence of the minister, so that no one goes away carrying the Eucharistic species in his hand. **If there is a risk of profanation, then Holy Communion should not be given in the hand to the faithful.**” (Paragraph 92)

Here are **7 common Holy Communion profanations** that I see all too frequently:

- *Blessing oneself with the Host before consuming it. (The act of blessing with the Eucharist is called “Benediction” and is reserved to clergy).*
- *Receiving the Host in the palm of the hand, contorting that same hand until the host is controlled by the fingers, then consuming it (resembling a one-handed “watch-the-coin-disappear” magic trick).*
- *Popping the Host into the mouth like a piece of popcorn.*
- *Attempting to receive with other items in the hands, like a dirty Kleenex or a Rosary.*
- *Receiving the Host with dirty hands.*
- *Receiving the Host, closing the hand around it, then letting the hand fall to the side (as if carrying a suitcase) while walking away and/or blessing oneself with the other hand.*
- *Walking away without consuming the Host.*
- *Giving the Host to someone else after receiving (including animals)...yes, it happens!”—excerpted from The Very Rev. Fr. John Lankeit’s letter*

Affairs of State

Flag Day, June 14th

(NEW HAVEN, CONN.) - The United States Supreme Court has refused to hear an appeal of a lawsuit challenging the constitutionality of the Pledge of Allegiance, thus ending a seven year battle involving two separate cases, one originating in California and the other in New Hampshire. The Knights of Columbus, represented by the Becket Fund for Religious Liberty, played a key role in defending the Pledge as a "defendant intervenor" in both cases.

"The Knights of Columbus is proud to have played a major role in successfully defending the constitutionality of the words 'under God' in the Pledge of Allegiance," Supreme Knight Carl A. Anderson said. "We were instrumental in persuading Congress to add those words to the Pledge in 1954, and they express a fundamental belief that we have held as a nation since our founding, that we 'are endowed by our creator with certain unalienable rights.' The notion that this somehow violates the First Amendment has now been soundly rejected by both the First and Ninth Circuit Courts of Appeal, and the Supreme Court has now allowed both decisions to stand. It is a victory for common sense."

The Ninth Circuit upheld the constitutionality of the Pledge in March 2010 and the Supreme Court refused to hear an appeal of the California case in March 2011. The First Circuit upheld the constitutionality of the Pledge in November 2010 and the Supreme Court denied certiorari in that case on, June 13, 2011.

Defend Marriage

Gov. Andrew Cuomo and gay "marriage" advocates are pulling out all the stops in their attempt to end our traditional and historic understanding of marriage as the lifelong union of a man and a woman. The Governor is touring the state and backing an expensive media campaign in an attempt to pressure Senators from both parties into authorizing same-sex "marriage." These advocates are planning to descend on the state Capitol in force soon in their final push. It is critical that you CALL your NY State Senator (Lee Zeldin (518) 455-3570 or (631) 360-3356) immediately to say you are a constituent and you are counting on his vote to defend the institution of marriage.

The New York Times indicates on June 13th, legislation legalizing same-sex "marriage" could be proposed and voted on in days. The fundamental message is simple: Marriage is a union of one man and one woman, for their good and the good of children.
