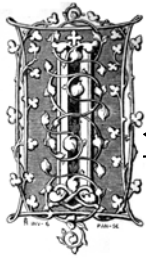

# Introductory Rites of Holy Mass

On November 27—in less than two months—we will begin to make use of the Roman Missal, Third Edition, in all celebrations of Holy Mass. The flow of the Mass will be exactly the same, however, some of the prayers and responses of the priest and people will be different, so it is not only important that we know what the prayers and responses are, but moreover, what they mean in the context of the Sacred Liturgy. (Please be assured that they will be published in the missalette/hymnal and available on special pew cards for the convenience of the congregation).

The reason for these soon-to-be changes is to bring the liturgy of English-speaking Catholics into greater conformity with that of the Universal Church and greater fidelity to many of the prayers and texts which come directly from Sacred Scripture. The 1969 Mass translations from the Latin, which we currently use, were made using a method that is called *dynamic equivalence*. This basically means that previous English translations did not accurately represent the meaning of the original Latin. They were very reflective of the in-use English of 1969. The Spanish, French, and Italian editions, for instance, made *classical translations* of the Mass, which were very faithful to the Latin *editio typica* (typical edition) of the Roman Missal. This is the rationale, and though some may say the language is “stilted”, we must see the entering into “God’s time” and what we do at Mass as different from any other context in which we may operate. Therefore, shouldn’t the language we use be somewhat different, as our holy faith is beautifully described as “being of ancient origin, yet on-loan to us from future generations?”

As the priest is approaching the altar, the **Entrance Chant** is sung. Every Mass has a proper entrance antiphon (introit) which is prescribed by the Church. While the antiphon is most proper to the particular celebration, our current practice since the Second Vatican Council (1962-1965) has been to sing a hymn as the priest and ministers process. The reason for this is that many English translations of the ancient Latin antiphons (mostly from Sacred Scripture) have not been set to music. Hopefully this will come about sometime in the near future. But for the time being, hymns are usually chosen that correspond to the readings of the day, the specific feast, or for the liturgical season.

When the priest arrives at the altar he makes a profound bow before it (or genuflects if the Blessed Sacrament is present in the tabernacle); he kisses it (the consecrated altar represents Christ. The priest’s power and authority to celebrate the Sacred Mysteries comes not from himself, but from Jesus Christ, and so this intimate act unites the priest to the High Priest who offers Himself) and then he may also incense the altar and the crucifix. Then he begins Mass with the sign of the cross, to which the people respond: **“Amen.”** Then the priest extends his hands in the greeting. The one most frequently used is, **“The Lord be with you.”** Yet to whichever greeting he employs (in this first greeting, a bishop says, **“Peace be with you”**), the response of the people will always be, **“And with your spirit.”** In their response, the people assure the priest of the divine assistance of God’s Spirit in using the charismatic gifts given to him in ordination, and, in so doing, to fulfill his prophetic function in the Church. (The priest, deacon, or another minister may then briefly introduce the Mass of the day.)

The **Penitential Rite** follows, in which, before we can enter into the Eucharistic Sacrifice, we need to acknowledge our sinfulness and ask almighty God pardon for our offenses against Him and our brothers and sisters. In all three forms, the priest invites the faithful to make the Penitential Act:

Brethren (brothers and sisters), let us acknowledge our sins, and so prepare ourselves to celebrate the Sacred Mysteries.

*A brief pause for silence follows.*

**“Form A”** is the **Confiteor** (Latin for “I confess”). All recite together the formula of general confession:

I confess to almighty God  
and to you, my brothers and sisters,  
**that I have greatly sinned,**  
in my thoughts and in my words,  
in what I have done and in what I have  
failed to do,

*And, striking their breast, they say:*

**through my fault, through my fault,  
through my most grievous fault;**

*Then they continue:*

therefore I ask blessed Mary ever-Virgin,  
all the Angels and Saints,  
and you, my brothers and sisters,  
to pray for me to the Lord our God.

*The absolution of the priest follows as previously:*

May almighty God have mercy on us, forgive us our sins, and bring us to everlasting life.

*The people respond:*

Amen.

*The **Kyrie, eleison** (Lord, Have mercy; Christ, have mercy; Lord, Have mercy) invocations follow, unless they have just occurred in “Form C” of the Penitential Act.*
