Preface, Sanctus, and Eucharistic Prayer

Following the prayer over the offerings, the priest then begins the preface dialogue: “The Lord be with you.”

According to the idea of thanksgiving which, after the example of the Last Supper (Matthew 26:27; Mark 14:23; Luke 22:17, 19; 1 Corinthians 11:24). forms a fundamental element of the Eucharistic service, all liturgies begin the Anaphora, the consecration-prayer, by thanking God for His benefits. Almost every account we have of the early liturgy mentions this. So prominent was this idea that it has supplied the usual name for the whole service (Eucharist, eucharistia). The thanksgiving-prayer enumerated the benefits for which we thank God, beginning generally with the creation, continuing through the orders of nature and grace, mentioning much of Old Testament history, and so coming to the culminating benefit of Christ's Incarnation, His Life and Passion, in which the story of the Last Supper brings us naturally to the words of institution. In most of the earliest liturgies this enumeration is of considerable length. It is invariably preceded by an invitation to the people: “Lift up your hearts”, and then: “Let us give thanks to the Lord”, or some such formula. The people having answered: “It is right and just”, the celebrant continues, taking up their word: “It is truly right and just first of all to praise [or to thank] thee”; and so the thanksgiving begins.

Such is the scheme everywhere. It is also universal that at some moment before the recital of the words of institution there should be a mention of the angels who, as Isaias said, praise God and say: “Holy, holy holy” etc., and the celebrant stops to allow the people to take up the angels' words. He then continues his thanksgiving-prayer... historically the Preface belongs to the Canon; it is the first part of the Eucharistic prayer, the only part that has kept clearly the idea of giving thanks. The name Præfatio” (from præfari) means introduction, preface (in the usual sense) to the Canon. Durandus explains its name as meaning that it “precedes the principal sacrifice”. (Excerpted from the Catholic Encyclopedia)

Then the Priest begins the Eucharistic Prayer. (*Please note that there are several changes*) Extending his hands, he says:

The Lord be with you. The people reply: **And with your spirit.**

The Priest, raising his hands, continues: **Lift up your hearts. The people: We lift them up to the Lord.**

The Priest, with hands extended, adds: **Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.** The people: **It is right and just.**

The Priest, with hands extended, continues the Preface. At the end of the Preface he joins his hands and concludes the Preface with the people, singing or saying aloud the *Sanctus*:

Holy, Holy, Holy Lord God of hosts./Heaven and earth are full of your glory./Hosanna in the highest./Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord. Hosanna in the highest.

In Latin, the exclamation is *Sanctus*, “*Sanctus, Sanctus Dominus Deus Sabaoth*,” as translated above. In Hebrew, plural form of ‘host’ or ‘army’. The word is used almost exclusively in conjunction with the Divine name as a title of majesty: “the Lord of Hosts”, or “the Lord God of Hosts.” The current English translation of “Lord God of power and might” for this phrase was not as accurate as “Lord God of Hosts”.

However, (especially as we enter into the Eucharistic Prayer, or Canon) this is not to be confused with our use of the word, “Host” for the bread offered to be consecrated into the real Presence of Our Lord. In this instance, the word is applied to Christ, the Immolated Victim (Latin, *Hostia*), and, by way of anticipation, to the still unconsecrated bread destined to become Christ's Body. In the Middle Ages it was also known as “hoiste”, “oiste”, “oite”.

Typically an animal (or even a human) was provided as victim for a sacrifice. In the Eucharist, *our Divine Savior* is the Victim. He shed His Precious Blood, *once*, and for *all*. He is made present to and for us (anamnesis) at the Consecration in the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass. We participate in His bloody sacrifice on the Cross through the un-bloody sacrifice of bread and wine offered in the Mass, wherein He promised that He is present with His words: “Do this in memory of Me.”

In the various Eucharistic Prayers that may be used, there is always the thanking of God most especially for the gift of Jesus Christ and the salvation of our souls that is offered through Him. The theme is basically the same: all is offered to the Father, through the Son, in the power of the Holy Spirit. In it, we thank God for His merciful love and salvation; we ask the intercession of the Blessed Virgin Mary and the angels and saints; we pray for the Pope, our Bishop; all clergy and all the people of God—the Church—throughout the world and for all people: the living and the dead; that we may all one day share in the fullness of Life.

The wording of the re-translated Eucharistic Prayers will be more poetic than the versions we are currently using. Again, these reflect more accurately the universal Latin typical edition. Though we hear them at Mass, reading them at some other time of prayer, whether in church or at home, reveals the heart of what we are all—not only the priest celebrant—to pray for, and *be*, in Christ our Lord.

The essential words of consecration/institution of the elements are now to be for the bread: TAKE THIS, ALL OF YOU, AND EAT OF IT, FOR THIS IS MY BODY, WHICH WILL BE GIVEN UP FOR YOU. And for the wine: TAKE THIS, ALL OF YOU, AND DRINK FROM IT, FOR THIS IS THE CHALICE OF MY BLOOD, THE BLOOD OF THE NEW AND ETERNAL COVENANT, WHICH WILL BE Poured OUT FOR YOU AND FOR MANY FOR THE FORGIVENESS OF SINS. DO THIS IN MEMORY OF ME.

Building Stronger Catholic Elementary Schools

An ongoing series on the 'Strategic Plan for Catholic Elementary Schools' *Vision for the Future*. 'The Diocese of Rockville Centre' released a 'Strategic Plan for Catholic Elementary Education' on September 22nd, outlining the goals and actions that will provide a future for Catholic elementary schools on Long Island that is fiscally secure, academically excellent and fully engaged in promoting the Catholic faith and values. This plan may be accessed through the diocesan website, www.drvc.org. The Strategic Plan was initiated in response to several distinct challenges beyond the control of our Diocese that confront us today and require us to examine ways to preserve and enhance our elementary schools for future generations of students and their families. Our challenges include:

CHANGING DEMOGRAPHICS: The aging population of Nassau and Suffolk counties is producing fewer children, leading to enrollment declines not only in Catholic schools but also in public, independent, and religious schools.

RISING COSTS: Rising operating costs have strained the budgets of parishes and the Diocese at the same time as the economic downturn has strained the budgets of families, making tuition more difficult to afford.

SOCIETAL TRENDS: Continuing secularization of society has diminished interest in religious education.

GOVERNMENT POLICY: The state government does not grant tuition tax credits to parents who send their children to Catholic schools, despite saving hundreds of millions of dollars by not having to spend state funds to educate Catholic school students.

Taken together, these factors go a long way to explain why fewer parents are choosing to send their children to our elementary schools. In the 1960s, our 'Diocese of Rockville Centre' had 92 elementary schools with 78,000 students. Last year, we had 55 elementary schools with 19,000 students. To address these challenges, Bishop William Murphy empaneled a special 'Bishop's Advisory Committee on Catholic Education', which has produced a Strategic Plan that provides a framework for preserving and enhancing our elementary schools. The Strategic Plan is about renewing and transforming our schools. We are at once renewing our commitment to our elementary schools and transforming them in ways that will make them better through high academic standards, faith-based learning, and programs that reflect the best practices in education today. By addressing our challenges together, we will overcome them and continue to offer outstanding primary education for our children. Each week we will be providing more information about the Strategic Plan and our vision for the future of Catholic elementary schools in our Diocese. 
