Mystery of Faith, Doxology, the Lord's Prayer and Communion Rite

(Please note the differences / variations in the following parts of the Mass from those we are now employing.)

Following the consecration of both the bread and wine into the Body and Blood of Christ, the priest genuflects in adoration. Then he sings or says: **The mystery of faith.** And the people continue with one of the following three acclamations: **We proclaim your Death, O Lord, and profess your Resurrection until you come again.**

Or:

When we eat this Bread and drink this Cup, we proclaim your Death, O Lord, until you come again.

Or:

Save us, Savior of the world, for by your Cross and Resurrection you have set us free.

At the conclusion of the Eucharistic Prayer, the priest takes the chalice, and the paten with the Host, and raising both, he sings or says the Trinitarian doxology (Greek, praise): **Through him, and with him, and in him, O God, almighty Father, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, all glory and honor is yours, for ever and ever.** The people acclaim: **Amen.**

After the chalice and paten have been set down, the Priest, with hands joined, sings or says the following invitation *only*: **At the Savior's command and formed by divine teaching, we dare to say:** He extends his hands and, together with the people, continues: **Our Father, who art in heaven...**

Following the Lord's Prayer and its *embolism* ("Deliver us, O Lord...") and the *prayer for peace*, the priest turns towards the people, extending and then joining his hands he adds: **The peace of the Lord be with you always.** The people reply: **And with your spirit.** Then, if appropriate, the Deacon, or the Priest, adds: **Let us offer each other the sign of peace.** And all offer one another a sign, in keeping with local customs, that expresses peace, communion, and charity. The Priest gives the sign of peace to a Deacon or minister. The ancient manner of exchanging the *Pax*, is for the one giving the Peace (the celebrating bishop or priest) to place his hands on the shoulders of the deacon, who, with his hands upturned receives the arms of the celebrant; they "embrace" from one cheek to the other.

Then at the *fraction rite*, the priest takes the Host, breaks it over the paten, and places a small piece in the chalice, saying quietly: **May this mingling of the Body and Blood of our Lord Jesus Christ bring eternal life to us who receive It.** Briefly, this ancient custom of the commingling of the consecrated elements originally took two forms. The first custom is that of the *Sancta*, in which a particle consecrated at a former Mass was reserved until this moment. The ceremony was meant to emphasize the unity of the sacrifice, to make, as it were, a continuation from one Mass to the next. The second custom is that of the *Fermentum*, in which, from about the 4th Century through the 10th, popes (and subsequently bishops) sent a fragment of the Host consecrated by him to suburban bishops and Roman parish priests. They received It, put It in their chalice and communicated from It. As the *Sancta* was a symbol of the identity of the Sacrifice from one Mass to another, so was the *fermentum* a sign of union between the bishop and his clergy. The symbol of unity and inter-communion is most obvious.

The *Agnus Dei* (Lamb of God) is sung or said during the Fraction Rite. The words remain the same as our current translation.

Then the Priest, with hands joined, says quietly his private preparation for Communion: **Lord Jesus Christ, Son of the living God, who, by the will of the Father and the work of the Holy Spirit, through your Death gave life to the world, free me by this, your most holy Body and Blood, from all my sins and from every evil; keep me always faithful to your commandments, and never let me be parted from you.**

Or:

May the receiving of your Body and Blood, Lord Jesus Christ, not bring me to judgment and condemnation, but through your loving mercy be for me protection in mind and body and a healing remedy.

They are beautiful words for any of us to meditate on before receiving the Most Holy Sacrament.

STRONG CATHOLIC IDENTITY: In the 'Diocese of Rockville Centre', Catholic identity is the defining characteristic and essential element in Catholic schools. The central ministry of our schools is to infuse an excellent academic program with Catholic teaching on faith and morals, a commitment to serving others, and a sense of the sacred.

Catholic schools produce students who are faith-filled and committed to living the Gospel message as proclaimed and taught by the Church. A strong foundation in the faith is more important today than ever because the growing secularization of society creates daily challenges for family life. "Catholic schools are parents' best friends," said Brian Shea, chair of the 'Bishop's Advisory Committee on Catholic Education'. "They reinforce the faith and values parents want for their children." Catholic schools are an invaluable counter-weight to the pervasive influence of modern culture and are a proven means to transmit faith to the next generation.

Catholic education supports the growth and development of the whole child—spiritually, intellectually, socially, emotionally, and physically—and meets the needs of the individual within a Christian atmosphere centered on Christ. The aim of our Catholic elementary schools is to create an environment in which faith, trust, and love for God and others are encouraged, lived, and witnessed in our children's lives. The impact of a Catholic education is life long: Students who attend Catholic schools demonstrate a command of religious knowledge and are more likely to participate in the life of the church.

As a vital part of the 'Strategic Plan for Our Schools', religious instruction will continue to be both a core academic subject as well as an underlying belief structure that is woven into all facets of curriculum and instruction. 'The Strategic Plan' is about sustaining and enhancing our elementary schools so they may continue to provide the excellent education and solid foundation in the faith that parents have come to expect. In the coming weeks, we will provide more information about 'The Strategic Plan' and our vision for the future of Catholic elementary schools in our Diocese. By working together—religious and laity, principals and teachers, parents and students—we can achieve our shared goal of creating a secure future for our schools. 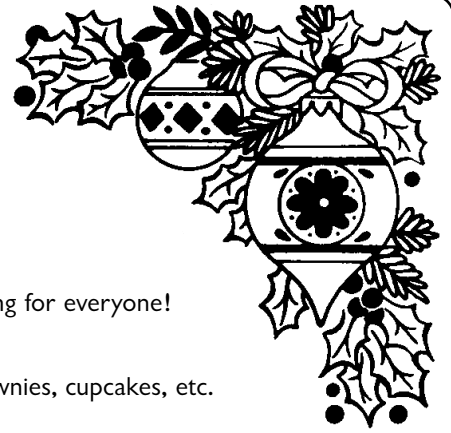
