# Consubstantial

It has been almost two months since the introduction of the Third Edition of the Roman Missal in English. In this period of time, we have been getting used to those prayers and responses of the Mass that have changed. I commend the parishioners of St. Jude who have been very good in making the effort to use the proper words the Church has given to us for the celebration of the Sacred Liturgy in English. This indicates that we are *docile*: open to or able to be taught. It is a sign of humility, not passivity. This, however, cannot be said of everyone, as there are a growing number of people in the world who are “Know It Alls,” a.k.a. “KIAs.” Since such persons know *everything*, how can they ever be taught *anything*?

This attitude is increasingly evident throughout our society, and one only need visit an internet blog (I *don't* recommend it!) on any particular topic, and read the commentary that flows from it, to realize that there are numerous people (of course not everyone) who seem to have very high regard for their own opinions (and those who agree with them) on a variety of issues. Whether those opinions are based in fact or not is of seemingly little consequence, even when it comes to Catholics discussing the Sacred Mysteries and the worship of the Triune God. The proper spiritual/intellectual disposition for Catholics is one of docility, acknowledging that Holy Church is the Mother and Teacher of the truths of the Faith, and that no individual's *opinion* should be given much weight, especially when it comes to such serious and sublime topics. Yet, sadly, it goes on every day. There are many self-appointed “popes” in the Church who freely proclaim their dogmas with apparent infallibility. The teaching of the Church flows from Christ, the Head, through the power of the Holy Spirit working in the Pope and Bishops—the Magisterium—and the whole Body of Christ.

One of the theological word changes that has been particularly squawked about *ad nauseam* for the last two months is *consubstantial*. While many of us may find that unique word curious, a number of people have become irrationally upset that the “out of touch” Pope and bishops have absolutely nothing better to do with themselves, and so are “forcing” Catholics to use (among other verbiage) an unfathomable, four-syllable word in the Profession of Faith (Nicene Creed), and that this is what is driving people out of the Church. Give me a break.

The reason for the current language changes in the Mass is not to divide or alienate the faithful, but specifically to unify us and make the prayers we use in English *more ecclesial*; that is, **more in union** with the entire Church, regardless of the specific vernacular language translations. 50 years ago (and for many centuries before), when Mass in the Roman Rite was in Latin, there was no complaining over the translations (which some people had in their hand Missals), which rendered the Creed with the words “consubstantial” and “incarnate” as they have been restored today. Instead of many Catholics being happy that they can hear and speak the words of the Mass in their native tongue, there are those who are having trouble with unity in the Truth, or may just be plain intellectually or spiritually lazy. How many people complain about using the infrequently spoken, five-syllable word “indivisible” in the *Pledge of Allegiance*? Scores of people can rattle off their ten-syllable medical conditions and medications, but we should protest about a word that speaks uniquely (as much as is humanly possible) about the very nature of the Blessed Trinity...? For those of us who are docile and want to learn and deepen in our knowledge and love of God, the following should help us on our way:

So what does “consubstantial” mean? It turns out there's a good reason the Church wants Catholics to learn this word. Dominican Father Romanus Cessario, senior editor for *Magnificat*, unpacks its meaning in the *Boston Pilot*:

*For the last 40 years or so, Catholics have become accustomed to express their belief in the sameness of the Father and the Son by the expression, “one in Being with the Father.” This translation came about because certain experts had opined that a literal translation of the Latin term “consubstantialem,” that is, consubstantial, would be too unfamiliar to the everyday churchgoer.*

*However, the expression “one in Being with the Father” does not translate “consubstantialem.” The expression is too vague. Since God creates and sustains all that exists, everything in some sense can be said to be one in being with God. Not that everything is the divine nature but that everything outside of God remains dependent on the divine nature for its borrowed existence. The sameness that the Eternal Son enjoys with the Father is not like that. Instead, this sameness arises from the specific substance or nature of the Godhead. Catholic faith holds that each of the three Divine Persons share one and the same divine nature or substance. Just as the mystery of the Blessed Trinity stands at the heart of our belief, so also it grounds our salvation.*

*The Greek expression adopted at the Council of Nicaea is “homoousios,” which is translated into English as “con-substantial.” The Eternal Son, who was born of the Virgin Mary, is neither “like” the Father nor “practically the same substance” as the Father. The Eternal Son enjoys the very same substance as the Father. The Son possesses fully the Godhead of the Father. So today, the Church again confesses in the English rendition of the Creed that Jesus Christ is “consubstantial with the Father.”*

Hopefully, that helps give us a little better understanding of one very important word for Christians. And some will also complain about *incarnate* (describing God assuming/taking on our human flesh), while not even realizing millions (quite mistakenly) believe in reincarnation... We have a long way to go, but by the grace of God, we will get there! Laugh and pray, brothers and sisters.

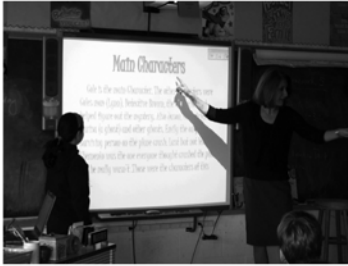
