Catholic Schools 2012

Some—perhaps a good number of us—have had the benefit and the blessings of a Catholic School education. Though those “I Survived Catholic School” bumper stickers (which really make me cringe) bear witness to the fact that not everyone speaks positively of their parochial education, my personal experience was a good one. I entered first grade at St. William the Abbot School, Seaford, in September 1972—almost 40 years ago. The principal, Sr. Jean Redigan, the half-dozen other Ursuline Sisters of Blue Point, and the dedicated lay teachers who taught there made a definite impression on my siblings, numerous neighbors, and friends who attended. My first grade teacher—Miss Bernadette Miller—is still there, and I do see her on occasion. Jesus Christ, Church/Sunday Mass, and Catholic School were very

much a part of the air we breathed. As a young boy, I thought that this structure was the way life was supposed to be for everyone. Though a bit naïve in my thinking, I was very blessed.

In the last several weeks, we have read in the papers or seen on television that six Catholic elementary schools in the Rockville Centre Diocese will be closing this coming June due to declining enrollment and increasing expenses. Some of these schools’ participating families have expressed their anger at the decision and have organized protests in efforts to keep their school open. Bishop Murphy and diocesan officials have been firm that the Strategic Plan will remain in place, and that the decision will not be reversed. Dishearteningly, some of these schools had become, or were swiftly becoming, severe drains on shrinking parish revenues. Though I don’t know the specific financial/enrollment positions of those individual institutions slated to close, I do know about ours—Our Lady Queen of Apostles Regional.

Catholic elementary schools in this country have a history dating back about 200 years. Briefly stated, in the 19th century, the United States was a predominantly Protestant country, hostile to Catholicism, and Protestantism strongly “flavored” much of public life and public education. St. Elizabeth Bayley Seton was one of the early proponents of a system of Catholic primary education. She laid the foundation for and inspired members of other religious communities, clergy, and laymen to found parochial schools. This system progressed into the 20th century.

With the post-war prosperity of the late 1940’s and 1950’s, a tremendous number of parish schools were built, especially here in the northeast. The Catholic population soared; Sunday Mass attendance by Catholics was more than 80%; churches were packed, and those who attended contributed a more substantial percentage of their income than the average parishioner does today; construction labor, material, and utility costs were comparatively lower than they are currently; and most significantly, the schools were staffed by communities of religious sisters (and brothers) who basically cost the parish little more than the expense of room and board. Therefore, the cost of a Catholic education was extremely affordable—in some cases even free of charge—and the classrooms were filled—some at 60 children in a class – with many children on waiting lists... Catholic life of 50–60 years ago has changed drastically! This reality must be acknowledged in order to understand the current situation.

I invite correction if I am mistaken, but I am not aware that any of our diocesan Catholic elementary schools sustains its expenses with tuition, fund raising, and individual private donations alone. There are no “profitable” schools in our system. Today, diocesan schools are no longer administered and staffed by virtually cost-free religious sisters, but mainly by lay women and men who receive (though not up to public school standards) salaries and fringe benefits. Buildings need to be maintained, heated and lighted. We all know about LIPA and oil/gas bills and various insurances. Technology, equipment, and furniture need to be updated, improved and replaced over time. Some grades have only 15 pupils or less per section which could easily accommodate 10 more at negligible expense; while increasing income by 10 tuitions. And costs are always rising... Each school board and administration is always looking for ways to increase revenue and cut expenses. The per-pupil cost for our Catholic elementary schools are a fraction of those attending public school. But whereas public education is funded through property taxes, parochial education is funded primarily through tuition and parish subsidies.

For Our Lady Queen of Apostles Regional School in Center Moriches, of the total budgeted operating revenue of \$1,409,547 for the 2011/2012 school year, \$785,059 was anticipated from tuition (177 students at \$4,308 per single child family), and \$330,000 (or 23.4% of budget) from supporting parish subsidies (representing 15% of regular offertory collections from each of the four participating parishes: St. John, Ctr. Moriches; St. Jude; Sts. Peter and Paul, Manorville; and Immaculate Conception, West Hampton Beach). Unless the tuition were raised to over \$6000 per single child at current enrollment, the school would not possibly be viable without parish subsidies. Moreover, St. John’s Parish absorbs additional costs that in fairness should be charged to the school, but are thankfully not. If Bishop Murphy/the Diocese mandated (as other dioceses have) that all schools have to be self-sustaining on tuition, fundraising, and individual contributions alone, would even a handful of our Catholic elementary schools be able to survive?

We at St. Jude support Catholic education, spiritually and financially. We support O.L.Q.A. School. I strongly believe in Catholic education, but I also believe that parishioners and school families should know that what it costs to fund our school is a significant sacrifice not only for the tuition payers, *but also* for each of the supporting parishes, who rightfully hope for a “return on investment” in the form of vocations and devout Catholics for the future life of the Church. I hope this overview (which could have been expanded with many additional details) reveals that parents, the Diocese of Rockville Centre, and our parishes have much invested in our parochial and regional schools, and that it is naïve to think that these entities can operate without considerable participation, effort, and expense. May God bless and help our Catholic Schools to grow and flourish!

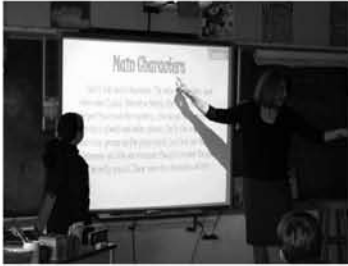
