Important Lenten Information

LENTEN REGULATIONS: All Catholics who have reached their fourteenth year are bound to abstain entirely from meat all Fridays of Lent. All Catholics between the ages of eighteen and fifty-nine inclusive are also bound to observe the law of fast on Good Friday. This means limiting oneself to a single full meal and avoiding food in between meals. Two other light meals, which together do not equal a full meal, may be eaten during the day. MORNING LAUDS: As has been the custom here at St. Jude, we will pray Morning Prayer (The Prayer of the Church) Monday through Friday at 8:15AM, followed by the Holy Rosary. LENTEN STATIONS OF THE CROSS: The Way of the Cross devotion will be prayed each Friday night during Lent at 8PM. Spanish Stations will be on Tuesdays at 7:30PM. Italian Stations will be on Wednesday at 7:30PM. SACRAMENT OF CONFESSION/PENANCE: Lent is a special time of grace in the life of the Church. It is a time when many people receive the grace to come back to the practice of the faith. It is also a time of ongoing conversion for each of us. The Sacrament of Confession/Penance is available each Saturday during Lent 12 noon-1PM and from 4PM-4:45PM and on Wednesdays from 2PM-2:45PM. We encourage you to make use of this sacrament.

ommandments

Last Sunday's reading from the Book of Exodus presented the Law of the Covenant—the IO Commandments—as they were given to Moses on Mount Sinai for the children of Israel and their descendants forever. Knowing what the 10 are is one thing; knowing the broader application of Commandments is imperative to understand what is right living and wrong living in our daily lives; what is most pleasing to God. Though

God gave this Law to his chosen people over 3000 years ago, it is no less valid today. The following material comes from several sources; primary among them is Outlines of the Catholic Faith: Revised Edition 2011 (pp. 52-54). Leaflet Missal Company. The first commandment...

I am the LORD your God: you shall not have strange gods before Me.

We are commanded to adore and worship the one true God (and acknowledge that there is none other) who has revealed Himself in the Old Testament and most especially in the New Testament in God the Son, Our Lord Jesus Christ. When we accept the first commandment, we accept God as Lord, as almighty, and all merciful. In accepting God, it follows that we believe what He says (faith), rely on His promises (hope), and respond to Him in love (charity) for what He has done for us. We are commanded to nourish and protect our faith. We are to adore God, pray to Him, and offer sacrifices, especially when we participate in offering the Holy Eucharist. We are to keep our promises and vows to God.

- We should not allow ourselves to doubt or neglect our faith.
- We must avoid heresy which is the obstinate denial by a baptized person of a truth taught by the Church.
- · Apostasy is also contrary to the first commandment. Apostasy is the total denial of the Christian faith.
- Schism is also contrary to the first commandment. Schism is not a denial of a truth or the rejection of the faith. Rather, a *schismatic* (one guilty of schism) no longer acknowledges the jurisdiction of the pope or refuses to be united with members of the Church subject to the pope.
- We must avoid the sins of presumption (that no matter how badly we sin or reject Him, God will still save us and bring us to heaven) and despair (that there is no hope of salvation).
- The first commandment includes the obligation that we should not be indifferent or ungrateful to God; nor can we be lukewarm about responding to His goodness and love for us. We are to love God and all those He loves.

Other sins against the first commandment include the following:

- Superstition: attributing the power of God to something other than God. For example, we commit superstition when we believe that certain ritual acts, such as throwing salt over one's shoulder, will protect us from harm.
- Idolatry: the honoring of a creature (any created thing: a person, money, etc.) in place of God.
- We commit idolatry if we practice polytheism, honoring more than the one true God. If we honored the Greek and Roman pantheon of gods, one would be guilty of polytheism.
- We also commit idolatry in placing anything in God's place. For example, those who worship the devil would be guilty of idolatry.
- Divination: placing one's trust for the future in things other than God's providence. We are guilty of divination when we try to discern the future through horoscopes, astrology, palm reading, interpretation of omens and lots; using tarot cards or ouija boards; having recourse to clairvoyants or fortune-tellers. Divination also occurs when we have séances or try to call on Satan; making use of magic or sorcery, which is the attempt to take occult powers or satanic powers for the purpose of controlling them for one's own purposes.
- Also included as transgressions of the First Commandment:
- Simony: the buying or selling of spiritual things which are not legitimately to be offered for sale.
- Sacrilege: the treating of those consecrated to God unworthily.
- Tempting God (challenging God to prove Himself to us)
- Atheism: the denial of God
- Agnosticism: the position which holds that men and women cannot know whether God exists or not.

The first commandment also includes the mission of the Church: to make Christ known to every human person on earth so that everyone can worship God. The first commandment presumes liberty so that all may worship one true God. However, people should never be forced to worship God against their own beliefs and consciences.
