# Commandments, (Part III)

(The primary source for the following is from *Outlines of the Catholic Faith: Revised Edition 2011*. Leaflet Missal Company.)

## **The Fourth Commandment: Honor your father and your mother.**

- By this commandment, we are commanded to honor all those whom God has vested with His authority, most especially those who are our parents. But this commandment also includes a call to respect instructors, teachers, leaders, Church and civil authorities, and magistrates.
- Children must obey their parents in all things except sin.
- Children are obligated to help their parents in their old age, or when they are sick and helpless, and to pray for them.
- Children must honor and obey others in authority while they are under their care. These people would include grandparents, other relatives, baby-sitters, teachers, coaches, etc., unless they are asked to do or comply with something harmful, sinful, or immoral.
- This commandment also requires parents to care for the spiritual and temporal welfare of their children.
  1. Parents are to make sure that their children receive the education they need to lead morally upright lives. Normally, this means that the parents choose the schools the children will attend.
  2. More importantly, parents are to teach their children the Gospel. Parents are to evangelize their children and show them the way to heaven.
  3. Parents are also to teach their children Christian virtues by word and example.
  4. Parents must be patient with their children, while correcting them wisely.
  5. Parents need to demand the respect and obedience of their children.
  6. In today's world, parents need to be particularly vigilant about the computer material, TV shows, movies, and videos their children watch.
- Parents are to respect the vocations which God has given their children.
- In this regard, parents must respect a call to the religious life given to one of their children. In fact, they should encourage each of their children to discern if God has given them a vocation to the religious life.
- Public authorities are obliged to respect each and every human person and each and every right belonging to each and every human person.
- This commandment obliges all citizens to contribute to the good of society.
  1. We should serve our country in gratitude and charity.
  2. We do this by exercising our right to vote, by paying taxes, and by defending our country.
- However, citizens are obliged to refuse obedience to laws contrary to the moral order.

(This series on the commandments will resume after Easter.)

Brothers and Sisters of St. Jude Parish,

As we enter into Holy Week, please remember that the liturgies of Holy Thursday, Good Friday, and the Easter Vigil and first Mass of Easter on Holy Saturday night are open to all. Technically, these three *Triduum* celebrations of the Paschal Mystery form one liturgy which takes place over three days: one flowing into the next, and culminating in the celebration of our blessed Lord's glorious Resurrection. Please know that you are welcome, and that the sacrament of Confession/Reconciliation will be widely offered this week at our parish and throughout the diocese (please see separate schedule in this bulletin). Take advantage of this opportunity God gives us to shed our sins and receive His forgiveness and mercy; especially if you have been away from Mass and the Sacraments for a long time. It is always a good time to come home to the Lord. And don't forget to ask for the "White Sale"—only one Hail Mary as penance, no matter how long it has been or what your sins are—when you come to confession... there's no better deal in town!

# Are You a Fully Initiated Catholic?

The **SACRAMENTS OF INITIATION** are Baptism, Confirmation and Eucharist. If you have not received all of these three sacraments, your initiation in our Catholic Faith is not complete. **TO SPONSOR SOMEONE WHO IS GOING TO BE BAPTIZED OR RECEIVE THE SACRAMENT OF CONFIRMATION, YOU MUST HAVE RECEIVED ALL OF THESE SACRAMENTS YOURSELF.** Some of our parishioners may not have completed their preparation for these sacraments when they were younger—they may have only been baptized or been baptized and received their First Communion. As in past years, we are offering a course for those who have been baptized and received the Sacrament of Eucharist as Catholics, but **HAVE NOT RECEIVED SACRAMENT OF CONFIRMATION.** This course begins Tuesday, April 10th at 7PM and will continue meeting once a week until May 22nd. Attendance is mandatory, more than one absence will result in you being dropped from the class. Material fee is \$20.00 per person. Must provide documentation of baptism and communion. You will be contacted by phone or email. All of the classes will be here at St. Jude in the parish center and run approximately an hour and a half to two hours.
