Commandments, (Part VI)

(The primary source for the following is from *Outlines of the Catholic Faith: Revised Edition 2011*. Leaflet Missal Company.)

The Seventh Commandment: You shall not steal.

This commandment commands us to practice justice and charity in the administration of earthly goods and the fruits of human labor:

- In the creation of man, God entrusted all the goods of creation to all people in common.
- The right to private property does not abolish what God gave to all men and women together.
- The right to hold private property is a means of justly distributing the goods of the earth to individual people.
- The right to hold private property must yield to justice when the holding of some good or goods violates justice or inflicts serious harm on other people. (For example, when people are starving, it is unreasonable and unjust for a landowner who has a barn full of grain not to make it available to those who are hungry.)

In all ordinary circumstances, we must respect the private property of others:

- We should never take what rightly and justly belongs to another.

Sins against this commandment include the following:

- Theft, burglary, or fraud.
- Deliberately damaging another's property. (Vandalism)
- Failure to pay a just debt or obligation.
- Failure to fulfill a promise or a contract.
- Failure to return what has been found or borrowed.
- The wasting of time, money, or property of an employer.
- Failure to pay employees a just wage.
- Neglecting to help the poor or those in need.
- Excessive gambling which deprives a person or those dependent on that person of what is needed.
- Reducing people to slaves or mere things for profit.

These sins require reparation. For example, goods stolen must be returned (or at least their value given to their legitimate owner).

This commandment enjoins on everyone to respect everything God has made. We must respect the environment and not leave future generations without the benefits of what God has given to all people of all time.

We must not cause animals to suffer needlessly or kill them for no reason:

- We may kill them for food and clothing.
- We may use them to help us in our work.
- We may even experiment with them for the sake of relieving human misery as long as the experimentation remains within reasonable limits.

This commandment includes the principle that the human person is the author, center, and goal of all economic and social life:

- Profit cannot be the sole motive. A concern for persons must also be present.
- Everyone has a right to work.
- Labor strikes are morally legitimate when they cannot be avoided and when they are undertaken without violence.
- Wealthy nations should help the poor ones.
- Everyone should help the poor.

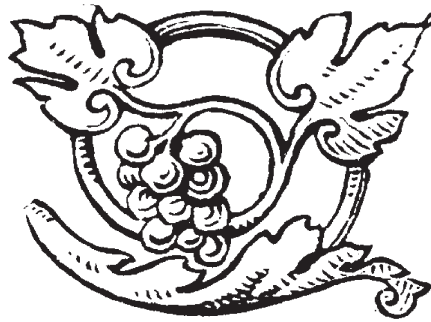

RELIGIOUS FREEDOM

understanding the basics ▪ defending a right

God's Gift, America's Heritage (1 of 7)

To the west of Nassau and Suffolk counties, a tower in lower Manhattan, rising ever-higher into the sky, bears the name of that which makes this nation great: freedom. America is synonymous with freedom. It is the hallmark of our republic.

Living in the land of the free, we inherit a legacy of liberty passed down from our founders. They put forth clearly and succinctly what freedom entails, enshrining the basic rights of every American in our nation's founding documents, most especially in the Bill of Rights. It was the genius of the American project to take what belongs to each person by virtue of their human dignity, their God-given liberties, and place these freedoms at the heart of a democratic society. In the United States, rights and freedoms were no longer the domain of rulers to parcel out. Here, those God-given rights were documented for all to see and none to snatch.

As believers, we hold especially dear our nation's guarantee to religious freedom and freedom of conscience. When the Bill of Rights was ratified in 1789, this freedom had the distinction of being the First Amendment. "Congress shall make no law respecting an establishment of religion, or prohibiting the free exercise thereof," our founders wisely declared. The United States Conference of Catholic Bishops Ad Hoc Committee for Religious Liberty's recent statement *Our First, Most Cherished Liberty* stresses the esteem with which those first citizens regarded this right.

"By the end of the 18th century, our nation's founders embraced freedom of religion as an essential condition of a free and democratic society. James Madison, often called the Father of the Constitution, described conscience as 'the most sacred of all property.' He wrote that 'the Religion then of every man must be left to the conviction and conscience of every man; and it is the right of every man to exercise it as these may dictate.' George Washington wrote that 'the establishment of Civil and Religious Liberty was the Motive that induced me to the field of battle.'"

With this appreciation of religious liberty firmly in place alongside other freedoms, the founders and a new nation set out on a bold experiment. Over the centuries, injustices in the application of our fundamental rights were overcome despite resistance and because of courage: freedom would no longer be conditioned by color; suffrage would belong to all. Setbacks came with growth, most egregiously when the fundamental right to life was denied to our most vulnerable, the unborn. However, as our union strove to become more perfect, respect for our fundamental rights, including our right to religious liberty and freedom of conscience, seemed assured. That is, until recently.
