# Christ the King

All throughout history the idea of royalty has held the fascination of many; In storybooks, television, movies etc., currently most evident in the ever constant barrage of media coverage on England's royal family. However, do we ever stop to think that as Christians we **are** true royalty, heirs to the Kingdom. On this beautiful feast of 'Christ the King' let us be reminded of our royal lineage. We are princes and princesses in the Royal family of God, through Jesus Christ, King of Heaven and Earth. Because of this most generous and gracious gift bestowed upon us by God, we should act accordingly...

(From a homily written in the second century) "Brethren, we ought to regard Jesus Christ as God and judge of the living and the dead. We should not hold our Savior in low esteem, for if we esteem Him but little, we may hope to obtain but little from Him. Moreover, people who hear these things and think them of small importance commit sin, and we ourselves sin if we do not realize what we have been called from, Who has called us, and to what place, and how much suffering Jesus Christ endured on our account.

"How then shall we repay Him? What fruit can we bear that would be worthy of what He has given us? For how many benefits are we not in His debt? He has enlightened our minds; He has called us sons as a father does; He saved us when we were about to perish. How then shall we praise him, how repay him for his gifts? Spiritually blind, we worshiped stones and pieces of wood, gold and silver and bronze, things made by men, and our whole life was death. Darkness enfolded us, and nothing but gloom met our eyes. Then, by His will, we escaped from the cloud that enveloped us and recovered our sight. For He saw our many errors and the damnation that awaited us, and knowing that apart from Him we had no hope of salvation, He pitied us, and in His mercy saved us. He called us when we were not his people and willed us to become His people.

. When he says: , he is speaking of us, for our Church was barren until children were given her. When He says: , He means that we tirelessly and in all simplicity offer our prayers to God. He declares that , because faith has now made our people who seemed to have been deserted by God more numerous than those who were thought to possess Him.

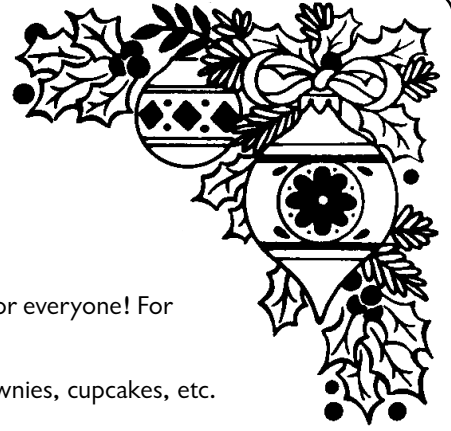
"Another text says: , for it is those who are perishing who must be saved. It is a great and wonderful work to uphold those who are falling, rather than those who already stand firm. Christ willed to save people who were in danger of losing their souls, and He has been the salvation of many. When we were on the point of perishing, He came and called us."

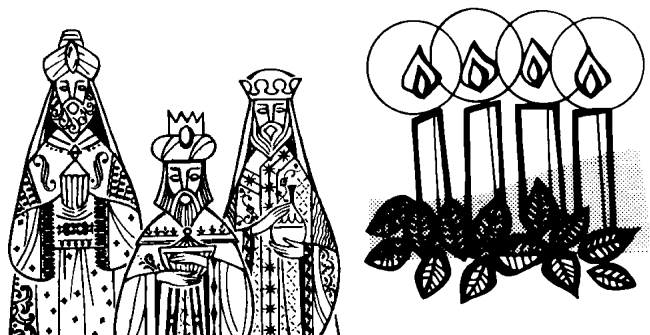

# Good News!

November 25, 2012

OUR LORD JESUS CHRIST, KING OF THE UNIVERSE

Dn 7:13–14 / Rv 1:5–8 / Jn 18:33b–37

A few weeks ago, our country elected a president. Though at this writing I don't know the results, I'm certain that whether your candidate won or lost, you're relieved that the endless speeches, debates, and recorded phone calls are over. It's exhausting to hear people endlessly promote themselves, whether it's for student-council treasurer or leader of the free world. We all grow weary of the promises, the list of accomplishments, and the often-false humility.

In a timely contrast, today's readings invite us to reflect on Jesus' kingship. Jesus—the one in whom many candidates claim deep faith—is crowned our ultimate leader, our king, in heaven. Yet his kingly leadership is so different than that of our leaders. The Book of Revelation claims he is “the one who is and who was and who is to come.” He's not in it only for four or eight years, after which he'll retire to a comfortable coastal

bungalow. Jesus' kingship is everlasting—he'll never falter, fail, or retire.

Revelation also claims “every eye will see him, even those who pierced him.” Unlike our presidential candidates, whose rhetoric divides the country, Jesus as king brings people together. And he certainly didn't know the basic rules of self-promotion—in today's Gospel, he refuses to claim the king title. Instead, he continually points to his Father and their intimate connection.

We're probably used to thinking of Jesus as our savior, our friend, our brother. But it's good to spend time this weekend pondering him as king. He's a profoundly different leader than any president, prime minister, or parliament.

And for this we can be deeply grateful.

### What should I do if I drop a host?

Last week at Mass, someone jostled me as I received Communion, and I dropped the host on the floor. I picked it up, and the priest took it and gave me another. Did I handle that correctly?

Dear Linda,

The *Tridentine Missal*, the Mass book from the Council of Trent (1545–1563), gave a lengthy procedure for picking up the consecrated host, washing the area it had fallen on, and then washing the cloth used to clean up. This extended ritual demonstrated a concern that not one particle of the host be trampled underfoot.

We still revere the Body of Christ, but the current *General Instruction of the Roman Missal* no longer gives such lengthy procedures, relying instead on the common sense and respect of the priest and the communicant. If the host falls on the floor, the priest or communicant should reverently pick it up and set it aside for later disposal by the priest. No other ritual cleaning is prescribed.

If the Precious Blood is spilled, wash the area with water, and then pour the water into the *sacrarium*, a special sink usually located in the sacristy that drains directly into the Earth instead of through the sewage system.

Sometimes, as in your case, dropping or spilling at Communion can't be helped—but it should be a rare occurrence. The host should be shared slowly as we remember that the One who feeds us died so we might live.
