Respect Life Sunday 2013

As most all of us have viewed on television/internet news, heard on the radio, or read in print, Pope Francis has made comments to the effect that the Church has been too focused on the moral issues of abortion, artificial contraception (a.k.a. birth control), same-sex “marriage,” and other related issues. While the overwhelming misinterpretation of his words by secular and “progressive” religious media outlets is that the Holy Father will be changing Church teaching on such issues, that is not the truth. They hear (as is possible for any of us) only what they want to hear and conveniently omit the information that does not serve their agenda. The Pope’s words have been twisted.

In essence, what the Holy Father was trying to relate is that for too long (perhaps the last 40 years or so), the Church has been spending an inordinate amount of time reacting to the culture of death, and has thus allowed Her critics and detractors to define and identify the Church simply as the institution that is only about being against abortion, contraception, sexual immorality, etc. Pope Francis rightly asserts that Holy Mother Church is first and foremost about Jesus Christ – who is the way, the truth, and the life, and all that the Church does is centered on Christ and flows from Him.

Pope Francis is not changing Church teaching on moral issues – he believes very strongly in the Gospel of Life – yet he wants the world to know that it is because of our faith in Jesus Christ that we believe so strongly in the truth of the human person, created in God’s image and likeness. Our bodies and lives are important due to God’s presence in us. Unfortunately, “the children of this world,” as our blessed Lord Himself would refer to them, do not have ears to hear what the Holy Father and the Mystical Body of Christ are communicating about and the Culture of Life. And so the duty of proclaiming and living that Culture is ever the more incumbent upon all of us in our daily lives.

In our own country and throughout the world, the dignity of the human person is downwardly spiraling by the day. We can become frustrated and tempted to rail at the evil and violence that has become all too prevalent in our world by thinking about:

- Abortion procedures done on innocent children – over one million each year in the U.S.
- The physical, emotional, and sexual abuse of children
- Mass shootings and acts of terrorism – the Boston Marathon bombing; Sandy Hook Elementary School in Connecticut
- Massacres in Syria, Kenya, Egypt and many other places
- The neglect of the spiritual, social and physical needs of persons with disabilities
- The elderly, sick, and dying persons who are alone, afraid, in pain, and unloved by others
- How it grieves God that greed/selfishness/financial considerations – not sacrificial love – dictate many societal and personal decisions
- The list could go on and on

This year’s theme for Respect Life Sunday is “Open Your Heart to Life!” Many of us may find it difficult to witness to the right to life and the inherent dignity of every human person, perhaps out of fear of being ridiculed, yet this is something we are called to do as Christians. If we remain silent while others promote the culture of death, then we allow evil – the absence of love – to triumph. If we, the Body of Christ, do not do it, who will? May the Holy Spirit embolden us, our Blessed Mother and Guardian Angel intercede for us, that we may bear witness to the love of Christ for every person, born and unborn, through our words and actions, that more hearts may be truly open to Life.
