## **CATHOLIC MINISTRIES APPEAL**

The 2015 Catholic Ministries' Appeal (CMA) has begun here at St. Jude and throughout our Diocese of Rockville Centre. Our original goal for this year was \$62,200. Due to the upcoming Capital Campaign to improve our parish building and grounds, St. Jude Parish petitioned Bishop Murphy and the Pastors' Advisory Committee (PAC) to consider a reduction in our goal. We are most grateful to Bishop Murphy and the PAC for granting us a one-year Capital Fund Adjustment. Therefore our 2015 goal is now 50% of the original amount, or \$31,100. Any monies that we receive in excess of 70% of the original goal – anything over \$43,540 – will be 100% returned to St. Jude.

A/o May 26th we have received pledges totaling \$68,870. Donors 185. Pymts' received \$45,055. Thank you to all who have so generously donated at this time

## r. Marie de Mandat Grancey

Dear Brothers and Sisters of St. Jude:

In January of 2008 I unexpectedly, yet happily, ran into a friend with whom I had not had contact in several years. We talked about what had been going on in our lives for the last few years since we had seen each other. She, her husband and their five boys had temporarily relocated to London for a couple of years for her husband's company, and now had returned to Long Island. I explained that I was now pastor of St. Jude, Mastic Beach for the past seven months, and about what was going on here, and that we had a large debt to pay off and work to be done, etc. After talking with her for a little while more, she asked me if I had ever heard of Sr. Marie de Mandat Grancey. I said, "Who?" She then explained about this French nun – a Daughter of Charity – with whom she became "acquainted" while overseas, and in whose cause for canonization she had been drawn to participate. She enthusiastically told me a little more about her and, giving me a small stack of Sr. Marie's holy cards, suggesting that I ask her intercession for our financial situation here at St. Jude. I gratefully took the cards, and later that day, I placed one of them in my prayer book so that I could ask Sr. Marie's help daily in my morning prayers. We certainly were in need of it!

Long story short, I began to ask Sr. Marie's intercession for our situation here, hoping that that our financial situation would improve and that possibly, by the time my term as pastor would be up, we might finally be out of debt. And as most of you well know, we paid off the debt several years ago and are current with our bills, and now are soon to launch upon a capital campaign to further improve our beloved spiritual home. While there were numerous factors involved in our debt retirement, I do partly attribute it to the intercession of Sr. Marie. I have been asking her assistance daily for our parish for the last seven plus years, and I have no intention of stopping! I know that Sr. Marie (and St. Jude and St. Joseph) is going to assist us with the capital campaign.

You are now asking, "So, who is Sr. Marie?" Adele Louise de Mandat Grancey was born in 1837 in the family castle in Dijon, France. Her family was well-off; yet the older generations had witnessed firsthand the horrible Revolution and Reign of Terror that all but destroyed the Catholic Faith in France, along with the monarchy, nobility, and many members of the clergy some 45 years prior. Though raised in a most comfortable atmosphere, Adele Louise saw a very different picture when the family spent half the year, from January to June, in their Paris residence. Paris was still in somewhat of a state of devastation with many living in abject poverty. Here the young patrician girl witnessed the work of the Daughters of Charity working among and ministering to the poor, and a desire to be one of them stirred her heart. Even as a pre-teen, she prayed to God that she might have the vocation, as she saw how a comfortable life could easily lead to the loss of one's soul.

In May of 1858, the wealthy and privileged Adele Louise, now as Sr. Marie, entered the religious life to serve Christ in the poor, and she always had from her earliest days a great love for the holy Mother of God. She served most admirably in her assignments as a nurse in France; often using her personal resources to pay the bills of the orphanage at which she was the Superior. During this time she read *The Life of the Blessed Virgin*, the mystical writings of Anne Catherine Emmerich. In this book, the house of our Lady in Ephesus, Turkey, is described in detail.

In the mid-1880's, when Pope Leo XIII called for French missionaries to volunteer to serve in the Middle-East, Sr. Marie responded, and was sent to Smyrna (Izmir), Turkey. Being in such close proximity to Ephesus, she longed to find the house in which the Mother of God and St. John the Evangelist lived. Fr. Jung of the Lazarists (Vincentians) also read Emmerich's writings, and after being prompted by Sr. Marie, he and his expedition followed the descriptions in the mystic's book, and Mary's house was found on June 29, 1891! After finding the Holy Virgin's House (*Meryem Ana Evi*), Sr. Marie, though under a vow of personal poverty, was able to use her family wealth to purchase this treasure where Mary lived and from whereabouts she was assumed into heaven, so that it may be preserved for all the ages for pilgrims – Christian, Jewish, and Muslim – to come and honor the holy Mother of our Savior. And so many have visited this holy place since its rediscovery. Some, indeed, who are reading this right now.

Today – May 31st, 2015 – marks the 100th anniversary of the death of Sr. Marie de Mandat Grancey. Whether she is ever canonized a saint or not, I believe that she has interceded for us here at St. Jude and will continue to do so. I will try to obtain more of the prayer cards for those who wish to ask her assistance, as well.

No students will be placed in your class until you submit the bulletin report. You must be up to date in order to teach. Thank you for your cooperation.

**For levels RCIC1 & 2 Upper, CP1 & 2 and High School 1 & 2 regarding Volunteer Service Hours-** You will be required to complete 5 hours of community service for 2015-16 school year. If you would like to do any or all of your 5 volunteer service hours during June, July, August or September, you will need to stop by the Faith Formation Office and pick up the Volunteer Service Form so that the representative may sign the form for the hours you complete. Suggestion: it might be easier to complete the volunteer service hours during the summer months rather than waiting for the school year to begin. The weather is nicer and there is much more sprucing up work to do outside than in winter months.
