Proper Attire for Serving at Holy Mass

A number of us have begun to enjoy the long-awaited summer, and we have had a number of very lovely days these past couple of weeks. I wish to offer a word of thanks to our liturgical ministers for your continued service at the Altar of the Lord throughout the summer months. With the many vacation plans parishioners have, I realize that it is sometimes difficult to get coverage for all of the Masses. I understand that everyone is doing the best they can. Thanks for your dedication to our Blessed Lord and His holy Church, and especially for your love and reverence for our Lord in the Most Holy Eucharist.

In addition to the particular functions that we perform, the very visible nature of serving at holy Mass puts all of us who do so in the position of having to set a good example (a very much needed good example). How we dress speaks volumes; and ever the more so during the summer months when “casual” can become very casual. And as much as most of us would like to see all worshipers be appropriately dressed, it is especially important that those in officially deputed roles of service lead the way. Neat ‘business-like’ attire is always the appropriate way to be dressed if you are a Lector or an Extraordinary Minister of Holy Communion. Even if you are not scheduled and are coming from the congregation to assist when the full complement of ministers is lacking, appropriate dress is always the rule. Regardless of the need, ***if one is not appropriately dressed, one should not come forward to serve.***

Regardless of the season, the vesture for clergy serving and distributing the Eucharist at Mass is legislated by the Holy See and the ancient practice of the Church. By the law of the Church, when priests and deacons distribute Holy Communion, they must always be vested in an alb (the full length white (baptismal) garment that covers the body from the neck to the ankles; with sleeves all the way down to the wrists. The stole must also be worn appropriate to their rank of Holy Orders. Sometimes an assisting cleric may distribute the Eucharist vested in cassock, surplice (short-ened white garment) and the appropriate stole. The Priest-Celebrant also wears the chasuble (the outer Mass vestment), and the Deacon dons the sleeved dalmaticin the appropriate color for the Mass of the Day. ***If clergy are not vested appropriately in an alb and stole or cassock, surplice and stole, they are absolutely forbidden from distributing the Most Holy Eucharist at Mass.*** Yes, you read that right - they are forbidden from serving at the altar unless properly vested.

Similarly, our young people who are altar servers wear white albs and cinctures (cord-belts) in the color appropriate to the Mass of the day. Even though they will be covered with the alb, they know to come to Mass in white shirts, black pants (or sometimes the young ladies are in skirts), and appropriate shoes; *not* sneakers. Though servers’ vesture is not legislated to the degree of that of the Sacred Ministers at Mass, the norm of vesture for servers in any church that I have ever visited is cassock and surplice or alb and cincture.

With that being said, it is time to “raise the bar” and make sure that if we are entering the sanctuary where the holy Sacrifice is offered to read the Sacred Scriptures or to distribute the Body and Blood of Christ, that we are dressed most appropriately. 40 years ago, when lay extraordinary ministers of Holy Communion were first permitted to distribute, all were dressed like it was Easter Sunday, and in many churches, robes were donned over shirts & ties and dresses. And now in 2016, we have air conditioning, which we survived without years back.

As the large Dress Code sign in the narthex/vestibule of the church indicates how we should (or should not) be dressed when we enter God’s house to worship, so it should apply all the more to our lectors and extraordinary ministers. No one’s clothing (or paucity of it) should cause distraction to the congregation or clergy. I have recently received complaints (well, a pastor ALWAYS receives complaints) from parishioners in regard to the inappropriateness of how some liturgical ministers have been dressing. Therefore, the following is a very basic guideline to adhere to:

Appropriate:

- Jacket and tie
- Long-sleeved, tucked-in collared shirts
- Shirts that are elbow length, both for women and men
- Shirts/blouses that have high necklines
- Dresses/skirts that are to the knee or longer
- Appropriate shoes
- Minimal jewelry – especially items that clang and scratch the sacred vessels

Inappropriate:

- Collarless shirts
- Tee-shirts
- Tank-tops
- Uncovered shoulders and upper arms
- Low cut shirts or blouses
- Tight shirts, blouses, pants or skirts
- Uncovered midriffs
- Shorts of any kind
- Short skirts
- “Dungarees” or gardening pants
- Clothing with writing or slogans on them
- Sneakers (unless they are appropriate orthopedic shoes)

It would be embarrassing for the Priest-Celebrant or Deacon to ask you to leave the sanctuary due to inappropriate dress. So before coming to church, referring to the points listed above, please look in the mirror and ask yourself, **“Do I look appropriate to enter the House of God and the Holy of Holies, and to distribute Holy Communion?”** I should hope that the answer will be “Yes.”

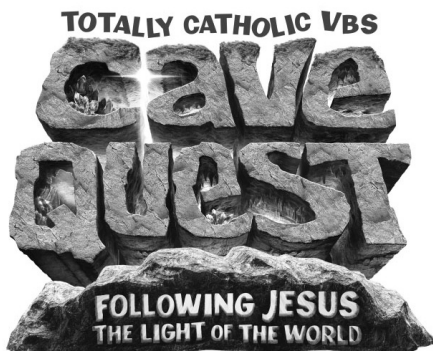
