**From the Pastor
October 2nd, 2016
Twenty-Seventh Sunday in Ordinary Time**

Dear Brothers and Sisters of St. Jude:

It has been a little over two-and-a-half months since you have seen and heard from me. For all of us time passes quickly in some circumstances, and in others, quite slowly. I hope that you are enjoying the cooler (and wetter) autumn weather after a relatively hot and dry summer.

Though we have not been in each other's presence for these many weeks, I know well the concern that you – the wonderful parishioners of St. Jude – have shown for me, especially during this time of my absence. I have received many cards and emails, and know that so many are praying for me. I am deeply humbled and grateful for the love and support that you have constantly given, and continue to show for me at this time. And please be assured that you are always in my prayers.

I thank Fr. Ronald Richardson and Fr. John Fitzgerald for having administered St. Jude up to this point; and, of course, to Msgr. Heinlein, Fr. Leone, and our deacons and staff for “holding down the fort” and keeping the life and work of the parish running smoothly. Yet I know that the presence of the pastor is important not only for the day-to-day “business” of the parish, but most especially for the spiritual/sacramental life through which Christ nourishes, heals, strengthens and builds up His beloved Bride, the Church.

I thank Bishop Murphy for his fatherly kindness towards me, especially at this time, and for generously extending my leave of absence so that I can continue to heal. I am also very grateful and pleased that the Bishop has appointed Fr. John Ryan as Administrator until the end of June 2017. This gives me a sense of peace that the parish is in able and caring hands.

Though I am still the Pastor, Fr. Ryan will be acting in my stead, so I ask you to most heartily welcome him and support him. Please do not try to compare him to me or to any other priest. Everyone has their individual personality and gifts, and Fr. Ryan has his, I have mine, and each one of us has those gifts that God has given us with which to do good.

Therefore, please be sure to pray for Fr. Ryan that our blessed Lord will work through him in his time here at St. Jude. With trust in God, give him some time to “get his feet wet”. PLEASE do not barrage him with lots of questions and requests - especially when he is greeting parishioners after Mass. I know that this transition time has been difficult for many, but if people only complain about whatever their issue(s) may be, without a willingness to personally participate in helping, the parish will suffer. Change is often difficult, yet try to keep an open mind and heart as Fr. Ryan gets acclimated. Remember no one person can do it all... but God can! A priest as one man can only be so effective in the life of the parish by himself. Therefore, with numerous dedicated parishioners who give of themselves to be the Body of Christ that they are called to be, much good will happen and the parish will continue to flourish. The good parishioners of St. Jude have been generous doing this, and I know that you will continue to so.

Though I will not be involved in the day-to-day operations of the parish during this time, as much as I am capable from off-site, I will assist Fr. Ryan and the Capital Campaign Team in moving forward with the new Shrine Chapel, Lourdes Grotto, Rosary Walk, and grounds, so that – please God – the vision we have planned and placed in St. Jude's hands will become a beautiful reality to the praise and glory of almighty God and the salvation of souls.

Again, please be assured of my prayers and love for you – the good and wonderful people of St. Jude who have been so loving and supportive of me over these past nine years, and particularly through the most recent difficulties. I know that I have your prayers and support, and for that I am most grateful. And remember, whether we are at St. Jude, Mastic Beach, St. Peter's Basilica in Rome, or a mission chapel in some obscure corner of the globe, when we participate in the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass, wherever we may be, we meet in Christ at the Altar...
