Letter from Fr. Ryan

One of the things I truly enjoy doing is going for long solitary walks where I can be alone with my thoughts and allow the voice of God to enter my heart. Actually, it's part of my prayer life: moments of silence, reflection, and praying the rosary. It doesn't take too much effort to just step outside and, well, walk. The benefits to our health, both body and mind, have been promoted by the medical profession and it seems every year a new health benefit is attributed to walking. Yes, I think we all know that walking improves our cardiovascular system, diabetes, arthritis, cholesterol and reduces stress. In other words, we don't need to sign up to a gym or buy some new exercise machine to get in shape and be healthy, body, mind and soul. All we really need is a good pair of walking shoes and make that effort to do an effortless exercise. I've been walking for almost thirty years and it has been the best medicine.

So, when I arrived here at St. Jude I went searching for a new place to walk, and I was filled with joy when I found a few locations such as the Smith Point Beach pathways, the local school track (they turn the lights on after dark!) and the Wertheim Wildlife Refuge. After settling in I walked four miles along the trail at the Wertheim Refuge and I knew I found my new walking route where I could find solace and pray and just see things more clearly in the eyes of God. To have that Refuge right here in our backyard is a gift. It takes us far from the McDonald's, Home Depots, cars, traffic, noise and puts us in a place so close to God and his creation. Trust me, walking is good for the heart in physical and spiritual ways beyond words.

Walking also helps our prayer life. In this Sunday's Gospel reading from Luke Jesus tells us of the necessity to pray without becoming weary. To pray is to be in that place away from the world and to be in that sacred space with God. Sometimes we can think that prayer is simply saying some words and then moving on to our everyday business. Sometimes we think prayer is reciting words from memory, prayer cards or books and not from the heart. Prayer is our time with God. Praying, whether it be the rosary or to a saint or to Jesus, is our time away from the busy-ness of our lives and it allows God to speak to our hearts. Praying strengthens our faith. As Jesus ends this week's Gospel about praying and the need to pray without becoming weary He warns us of a world without giving time to God: "I wonder when the Son of Man returns, will he find faith on earth?"

Speaking of praying and health, October is Respect Life month and it is always important to promote and help others to see the dignity and sanctity of all life, from conception to natural death. But it should go further into the way we live our own lives and give thanks to God, creator of you, me, and all creation! Giving God praise and glorifying Him in all we do is praying. Yes, we all have our comforts that may not be the best for our health, be it the chips, Doritos, Big Mac and fries, a Dunkin Donut or two, perhaps it is smoking, drinking a Budweiser, Coca-cola or a Starbucks mocha-frappacino and so many other so called treats. It's part of life, I guess, but it is important to have a balance and not over indulge and wreak havoc on our health, body and soul. In regard to Respect Life we need to have that balance and take care of ourselves, to respect ourselves and others. Perhaps we can treat ourselves to a walk along the beach, the park or the street. Perhaps we can have fun raking leaves or going to a pumpkin farm with the kids. There are so many things to do that will truly make us feel good, both physically and spiritually. The more we participate in God's creation, by being active under the sky and the eye of God, we give Him glory and begin to transcend into the divine! Let us all respect life and not allow a day to pass by without living it with joy and praying with praise and gratitude.

Life is a gift meant to be lived in the spirit of mercy, compassion and to love our neighbors as ourselves. Yes, let us love one another as Jesus loves us.
