We are aware that during these unprecedented times of COVID-19 and the cancellation of liturgies, our parish is experiencing a financial strain.

In an effort to help you to continue to donate your weekly offertory, the Diocese of Rockville Centre has established an emergency funding method for our parish's weekly collection – Text to Give for Parish Offertory. You can text our parish's unique keyword to our designated number.

Here is how it is done:

The process: Parishioners are able to use a credit card and even set up a recurring donation. Funds for our parish will be received into an account at the Diocese of Rockville Centre, where we will be able to keep track of our parish's individual offertory donations. At the end of the month, the Finance Department will internally credit our parish's account with the donations received.

Anyone with a mobile phone with the ability to text can participate in this effort.
